I participated recently in a Zoom meeting with other Department Treasurers. It was very interesting to see old friends and meet the new Department Treasurers.

Some of the items that we discussed:

#### \* DATES OF BIRTH

We need accurate date of birth on all applications. This helps us to confirm if we have a duplicate member or not. Susan Jones with a DOB of 5.13.56 is not the same Susan Jones with a DOB of 12.3.48. If the DOB is different when I'm inputting the second Susan Jones as a new member, MALTA will let it go thru. Otherwise I have to stop, confirm that the member is in fact not a new

member but a Rejoin or a Transfer.

### **\*TRANSFERS**

Please include the membership number on Transfer Applications and attach a copy of their current membership card. Saves me lots of time if I don't have to look it up or contact National Headquarters to get their number.

### \*MALTA TIMEOUTS

We extended the time that MALTA gives you to 30 minutes. If there is no activity the system will "time out" after 30 minutes and then you'll have to log back in. This is a security feature to keep prying eyes out of MALTA.



### \*MESSAGES THRU MALTA

When you open MALTA you see this icon for messages. We are working on enabling that feature so you can get personal messages from National Headquarters and also messages specific for Treasurers, Secretaries.

### **\*ZOOM MEETINGS**

In the near future, I'll be setting up a Zoom meeting for Treasurers and one for Secretaries. I know that it's impossible to schedule so everyone can attend but I will probably host one on a weekday afternoon and one in the evening. Look the invite soon!

### \*COMPREHENSIVE MEMBERSHIP REPORT (CMR)

Both Secretaries and Treasurers will find a new look when they click on Reports. Check it out! The CMR is posted there. That report gives you the Membership status for your paid/life members. If a member pays their dues and then passes away, that member is still included in the your membership count. If a membership is cancelled, that member is included in your membership count until next year.

But if a member transfers, they are subtracted from your count and added to the count of the Auxiliary that they transferred to. This alleviates a member being counted twice.

As defined by the Merriam-Webster dictionary, Americanism is "an attachment or allegiance to the traditions, interests, or ideals of the United States."

There are many patriotic holidays throughout the year when we can promote Americanism. This is a great way to involve families and the community and bring attention to our organization. Now, more than ever, we need to practice, teach, and recognize Americanism. As members of the VFW Auxiliary, we need to spread patriotism within our Posts as well as our communities! September's patriotic holidays include Patriot Day, POW/MIA Recognition Day, and Gold Star Mother's and Family Day.

### Patriot Day – September 11

Let us not forget the lives lost on this day. Let us show how united we can stand on this day – just like we did on that dreadful September day in 2001. Though we have to maintain social distance, and not gather in large groups, we can still show how united we are by flying our Flag, hosting or participating in an outdoor ceremony and/or making a tribute video and sharing it on social media.

### **POW/MIA Recognition Day – September 18**

Auxiliary members are passionate about bringing attention to Prisoners of War and those Missing in Action. One way to honor these veterans is to educate youth and the community about who POW/MIAs are. This can be done by holding a Missing Man Table ceremony at a restaurant, hospital, library, community center or assisted living facility. Leave the table set for a week or so; display a list of each item's significance for people to read. The table provides a physical and visual reminder of POW/MIAs and that we will never forget their sacrifice.

### Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day – September 27

We, as a country, owe our Gold Star Mother's and Families a debt that can never be repaid. We must honor them and their loss by making sure their loved one is never forgotten. Try and find your local Gold Star Mother's and Families. Ask them their Stars' name, a bit about their Star, and tell them you will never forget. Ask how you can honor them and their fallen service member's memory. (When honoring these families there should be no applause.) You could plan a socially distant ceremony or reception at a local park or outdoor

location and present them with a certificate in their honor. Let them know that we, as an organization, will never forget their sacrifice and their Star.

As part of the Arizona Circle of Excellence, Auxiliary Chaplains must assist the Auxiliary in coordinating an event to honor Gold Star Mothers and Families, Blue Star Mothers and Families, White Star Families and Silver Star Families and submit a report to Department Chaplain.

### Arizona Gold Star Military Medal

The Arizona State Legislature has created the Arizona Gold Star Military Medal to honor Arizona members of the Armed Forces of the United States of America who have been killed in action since Arizona became a State on February 14, 1912. **Eligibility** 

Members of the Armed Forces of the United States who served in time of conflict and meet the criteria may be awarded the Arizona Gold Star Military Medal. Only one medal will be issued to the next-ofkin per qualifying individual.



### Criteria

A member of the Arizona National Guard, United States military reserves, or regular United States armed forces who was a legal resident of this state at the time the member was killed in action or died in the line of duty while deployed in support of combat operations.

### Application

The families of qualifying individuals applying for the Arizona Gold Star Military Medal must complete an application form and forward the request along with a copy of DD Form 1300, Casualty Report attesting to the fact that the qualifying individual was a resident of the State of Arizona at the time of death. In addition, the request must include a copy of proof of relationship as father, mother, marriage, baptismal certificates, or a notarized certificate which clearly shows the relationship.

### Presentation

Once eligibility has been verified, the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services will contact primary next-of-kin to schedule a presentation ceremony if desired.

### Arizona Gold Star Family License Plate

\$25 initial application fee/ \$25 annual renewal. The applicant must be a spouse or (by adoption or blood) a child, parent, brother, or sister of a person who lost his/her life while on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces. \$17 goes for construction and maintenance of the Enduring Freedom Memorial. May be ordered <u>online</u>. May be personalized with a maximum of 5 characters. Available with a disability symbol.



#### Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award

Effective this Program Year, the VFW has updated the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award program. There will not be a National Teacher of the Year. Each Department winner submitted to VFW National Headquarters will receive a citation for the teacher and their school. These will then be forwarded to the Department Headquarters for presentation. Entry's for the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award are due to the Post by October 31.

This is a time that they can try and gather what they need and yet they are contending with those who live in Show Low and Pinetop-Lakeside for goods which are in short supply.

- 7. After the meeting

Another good tool on the Chief of Staff resource page is a handout on suggested talking points from the District President to the Auxiliary President. It gives you suggestions on how to reconnect with the members and rejuvenate with members and get them involved in the Auxiliary. Also, on the resource page is two different District inspection sample notification letters, and the District meeting introduction list.

Reminder District Presidents; please distribute a copy of the completed Official Visit Form to the Auxiliary President, Department President Melody Judd, Department Secretary/Treasurer Kim Sloan, and myself as the Chief of Staff.

There are many Women Veterans that haven't seen a Service Officers or a VA Representative. Many Women Veterans do not know about the benefits or services available to them. Refer them to a Post Service Officer, or State

Service Office located at VFW Headquarters in Tempe so they can secure the benefits that they have earned.

### VA prepares to welcome volunteers back to health care facilities

**WASHINGTON** — The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced today plans to gradually and safely reintroduce volunteers to its health care facilities.

While volunteers are important to the operation of VA services and programs, most volunteer activities have been paused to prevent the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19.

"Just as our facilities are gradually reinstating services, volunteers are slowly reintegrating into them," said VA Secretary Robert Wilkie. "Volunteers are an integral part of our health care teams, offering fundamental services. We look forward to their return."

Some volunteer roles will be new, while others will stay the same, be modified, go virtual or remain paused as a precaution to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Individual VA facilities will tailor the reintegration of volunteers based on the facilities' operational needs and the volunteers' abilities.

Volunteers can expect the following safety measures:

**Phased reentry:** Volunteers are being asked to return to duty on an asneeded basis while maintaining physical distancing. VA asks that volunteers do not return to the facility unless they have been approved to do so.

**Retraining:** Volunteers must complete an orientation and training on VA's policies and procedures. This includes the proper use of personal protective equipment including face coverings.

**Health screenings:** Volunteers, like staff and patients, must consent to being screened for COVID-19 exposure and symptoms prior to entering facilities. These actions are being taken to protect the health, safety and well-being of Veterans, staff and volunteers.

This year, Carmelita Jones, our 2020-2021 National Legislative Ambassador, is keeping us on point with three steps to accomplish that duty: <u>Be an advocate – Join the VFW Action Corps</u>– Spread the word about veteran issues by encouraging general public to sign up for this important newsletter. <u>Be Informed – Know the VFW Priority Goals</u>– To strive for a Goal you must understand it.

<u>Be Engaged – Use the VFW & VFW Auxiliary Legislative Tools & Resources</u>– Strap on your Toolbelt and let's get going!

While we are all struggling with how to fulfill our missions during the restrictions placed due to Covid-19, we have an important role in something that can shape our future. Every 10 years the U.S. Constitution mandates a census of the population. Based on the reported population, funding is calculated for communities which utilize the funding for needed services. These services can include: health care, emergency services, and education. The census also helps determine the number of seats that each state holds in the U.S. House of Representatives, and the federal funds to be allocated by state, local and federal law makers every year for the next ten years. These funds and the representation in Congress effects the services available for our veterans and their families. While some primary voting has determined the outcome of variouslocal elections, there are many offices to be determined in November. We are a nonpartisan organization and as such do not advocate for any party or candidate.

4 Ways to Participate in National Voter Registration Day (Without Leaving Your Sofa)

1. Register to vote. By far the best and most important way to get involved

is to register to vote yourself.

- **2.** Post something on social media. National Voter Registration Day is all about awareness.
- **3.** Find and spread word about an event in your area.
- **4.** Directly reach out to five friends or family members.

Once a prospect has answered that, then tell them why you are an Auxiliary member (keep it short). Give them the enthusiasm of why you joined and what you do. Ask them to join. Ask them is there anything that the organization might be able to assist them with.

Expect more noes then yeses. An old sales quote is there is 99 noes before you get a yes!



Our National Organization has Mentoring Teams that include but are not limited to National Officers, National Ambassadors and our always willing to help National Office Staff. Our Department President Melody is developing a Department Mentoring Team

utilizing the Department Officers, Past Department Presidents, District Presidents and Auxiliary members. Her ROCKS!

District Presidents, we are asking you to find 2-4 members within your district that you believe will be good mentors. Remember that mentoring topics can include programs, bylaws, ritual, protocol, etc. A mentor does not have to be an expert in all areas but should have a good working knowledge of the organization. Your District Mentoring Team will help you and the members of your district and may also be called upon to help auxiliaries outside your district. Please submit the names and contact information for your Mentoring Team to the Department President and myself. These are your ROCKS!

Auxiliaries should also have Mentoring Teams. The responsibilities of this Team would be to make sure someone sits next to new members for their first few meetings and make sure they understand the information in their New Member Packet, ensure that all members know how to access information on the National and Department Websites, coordinate training sessions, encourage other members to become mentors, etc. Use your Auxiliary ROCKS!

As a Department we are working on Train-the-Trainer sessions to help mentors become more confident in their roles. In the meantime, please have your Mentoring Team contact me and I am happy to work with them one-onone.

Auxiliaries can qualify for a National Award by having a Mentoring for Leadership activity during a business meeting. A Mentoring activity might be a bylaws scavenger hunt, a game show with questions about programs, bylaws, membership and ritual, or a quiz that is handed out prior to the meeting and returned to the President at the end of the meeting with the members getting the most correct answers receiving a prize at the next meeting. These are just a few ideas. Come up with something FUN and INFORMATIVE. Use your Mentoring Team to help.

District Meetings are designed as a School of Instruction; so what better place for Mentoring! Districts can host training sessions apart from the regular meeting as well as activities during the meeting. Remember fun and informative.

As honoring our Blue Star, Gold Star, Silver Star and White Star Families is new to our Americanism Program this year, I ask that all Auxiliaries and Districts have a *Mentoring Moment* on who these families are and what the color of the star denotes. Several important Patriotic events take place in September.
