Greetings to my brothers and sisters in the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary. It's almost Christmas again. We've all been so busy the time flew by. And now with Christmas shopping to do, parties to plan, family to visit, we must

not forget our veterans.

Veterans become our worry and pleasure when they join the service. No matter how they get in they have made a commitment to all of us with their lives. And we in turn owe them our attention forever after. There are so many programs available, and we do lots to make them aware but perhaps the most difficult mission we have is to fill their needs when they are hospitalized long or short term. Not forgetting the families of these men and women, they too have made sacrifices, so all our lives are made better.

I spend a lot of time contemplating ways to help the long hours of recuperation or just survival after injury and age take a toll. We are few in number and that's a tall order. So, it is most important that we recruit others like us who can give a little time. The hardest part of this task is asking. We must talk to many about the need to find a few who are willing. Have you looked in your community for public forums where you can create a display for a chance to recruit? I found two people who already do hospital work just by mentioning the subject yesterday. Think about how many patients **YOU** touch each month and multiply that by every volunteer we find.

Several auxiliaries have applied for hospital grants for wonderful things, but a lot more have yet to apply. Think about ordinary things that can pass the time like puzzle books, jigsaw puzzles, books (even kindle), coloring books, crayons, art supplies, colored pencils, DVDs, Legos, building blocks, fidget quilts, Joy for All pets with pet carriers, or journals. How about even daily calendars with fun facts or even inspirational quotes? You get the idea. We cannot be there all the time, and all these things help pass the day.

Last but not least, you need to share with all of us by reporting and also posting ideas we all can use.

Happy Holidays! This is a time to devote to family, friends and enjoy this past year while waiting for 2025. May you have joy, blessings and wonderful Christmas as I hope your Thanksgiving was as well.



Winter Wonderland is on its way! October and November proved to be a hectic time for our elected. **WOW**, what a ride and no one was ready for the results. Did you get out and vote? Did you let all the candidates know what we wanted for our Veterans and their families? If you watched the debates on TV or

podcasts or various election websites, were you disappointed Veterans were not of greater importance? We got relegated further down the line by what are some very important problems facing us the next 2 and 4 years.

Thank you to all the Post/Auxiliaries that hosted forums and Meet and Greets and members who went to events around their area. Please forward a picture of you with your I voted sticker and fill out the project reports and Program Activity Reports to let us know that you voted, transported people to polling sites, worked the polling sites and how many letters, phone calls or in person contact you had in support of your Veterans.

Now our work begins anew. As we are ending 2024, there are some important bills still in place that we need to let those still in the office know to pass. Let's get out the 2024 Priority goals to the Senators and Representatives before recess. Send a **Thank you** (Christmas Card) to the ones leaving the office and encourage them to continue to support veterans. Let's also send a welcome note to the incoming elected and include the priority goals also. Your quartermaster can order if you are out. In January the 2025 Priority goals are coming out and you can again get to the officials in Washington to remind them that we will be contacting them many times to advocate for Veteran programs and help.

Recently the House passed the Elizabeth Dole Caretaker Act, but it is expected to stall in the Senate which would delay it considerable. Please watch or sign up for Action Corps weekly and watch for alerts and click on the call to action to send letters to your Senators. Take the time to write and encourage or if near their offices in your town, stop in and encourage them to vote yes. The Ellizabeth Dole Act is an immense tool to help our Veteran caregivers who are mostly family members. It also addresses the problem for the spouses when their Veteran passes and they are once again facing loss of income. Yes, many caretakers must give up a job to take care of their veteran and then if the veteran passes once again face an income change. This bill is 246 pages long, so please let's advocate for this important bill.

Another bill still awaiting action is the Major Richard Starr bill which focuses on fixing the unequal way disability and retirement pay are handled. As this is a short month for Congress, it will be hard getting much accomplished going forward and into the transition period in January, but we need to keep our voices heard. - Arizona VFW Auxiliary Educational Grant Current member of an Arizona Auxiliary and must be 18 years or older. Essay of not more than 300 words on how this grant will help you attain your goals and answer questions on application. This is due to me by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025.

# PARs (Program Activity Report)

Our Website, <u>VFWAUXAZ.ORG</u>, contains the Google form to be used for your regular reporting. This is the only form being used this year! You can find the form behind log

in/program activity report. This is also where you can find the tracking sheet each month. Please take the time to look at the tracking sheet to make sure you Auxiliary's PARs are being recorded.

Please remember that in order to be considered for the Outstanding Auxiliary Award, your Auxiliary must turn in 12 PAR reports.

We have made your reporting so very simple; it can be done in a matter of minutes! It is a new year and Program Activity Reports (PARs) are so very important!

This is the monthly or quarterly report every Auxiliary sends to provide numbers to the Department of Arizona, then, National, starting every year in April. Why are these numbers so important?

All these numbers are important because they demonstrate our Mission to support our Veterans and their families through our Programs. Every Donation, act of charity, Fund Raiser, Patriotic Festivity, etc., is what we need so desperately to hear about. When we compile all these numbers, they affect our ability to represent our Veterans and their families in the legislature to get and keep what is owed to them in Benefits, Support and Understanding.

Here are some examples that should be reported on your regular PAR:

- Providing Flag Education, Patriotism, POW/MIA and Star Family Recognition
- Supporting local Community Groups (hours and number of members)
- Poppy Distribution and Displays and National Home Education and Fund Raising
- Regular Newsletters or Emails to your Members as well as Mentoring Projects
- Members who regularly assist Veterans and/or their families with rides to the doctor, grocery shopping, well care visits, etc.
- Hospital work or donations, including Honors Escort Education
- Membership recruitment, retention, and appreciation
- Special Recognition Events
- Assisting the VFW with Voice of Democracy and Patriot Pen Scholarships
- Donations and Fund Raisers for Scholarships (all)
- Any assistance or donations for Veterans and their families
- Books donated for Youth and support provided for "Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue" and Illustrating American Contests for Youth

This is not a complete listing of things to report, just a short listing to keep us from forgetting to report EVERYTHING!
