We have one more Secretary – Treasurer – Trustee Training on Saturday January 26, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. at VFW Post 769 Quartzsite.

I took some time off in December for the holiday. So, if you've sent in membership transmittals, I am working to get those caught up this month. Since we still have 230 annual members that have not paid their 2025 dues, I thought I'd better explain their status. Those 230 members are now considered lapsed, and they are no longer members in good standing. They may attend meetings if allowed by the President but cannot enter into

discussions and cannot vote.

I would suggest that when the Conductor checks the membership cards at the beginning of the meeting, that the Conductor remind the member that they will need to remain standing until the President acknowledges them, and the restriction regarding discussions and voting. If there is time, the member should be allowed to pay their dues before the meeting.

I would also suggest that the Secretary or Treasurer contact those members before the meeting to remind them of their lapsed status. Be kind and gentle so as to not embarrass a member.

Audits for the 4th Quarter 2024 (Oct Nov Dec) need to be completed and approved by the Auxiliary by February 28, 2025. Treasurers – please send me a copy as soon as it's approved. Do not send to me until the Auxiliary has approved the Audit Report.

The Audit Report is to be read and approved or disapproved under Reports of Committees....Not under Report of Trustees. The Ritual states "The Audit Report is called for after each quarterly audit and is the **ONLY REPORT** accepted by motion."

Hello Team Az! Happy New Year!!!

This month's article is about what qualifies and doesn't qualify. I will give you examples on both. Remember this is just a few, not limited

to only these. You can always look on the Department website under community outreach tab for the "VFW Auxiliary Outreach Guide" to help identify what does and doesn't qualify.

EXAMPLES THAT COUNT:

- 1st responders (Police/Fire/EMT): working with local Police Dept. helping with child ID kits, local Fire Dept. helping with fire safety and prevention, local EMT, helping them with a CPR training.
- Local library: reshelving books, working the information desk
- Animal Shelter/Humane Society: walking animals, cleaning kennels, groom/wash animals, sort out toys/donations/food supply.
- Soup Kitchen/Food Banks: sorting food into boxes, sorting out donations, serving food, cleaning, set-up/take down tables and chairs
- **Environment**: plant trees, plant flowers, pick up trash, pull weeds.
- Health: volunteer at walks/runs by helping with registration table, manage the water stations, be a timekeeper, direct runners to where they need to be.

EXAMPLES THAT DON'T COUNT:

- Donating money to a charity
- Donating or collecting items/goods to an organization
- Dropping food/items at a homeless shelter

- Doing repairs/maintenance to the Post
- Flying an American flag
- Working with the Post to serve breakfast/lunch to the public
- Walking at the walk-a-thon
- Cooking food for your neighbor or Post/Auxiliary member

Please remember you are there helping another organization and helping their event to be successful. You are donating your time and doing physical labor. This is one opportunity to possibly show how the local VFW and Auxiliary care about the community.

Please don't forget, to log in the Department website (<u>vfwauxaz.org</u>) and fill out the project report. Please remember that Auxiliary Outreach **cannot** be combined with any of our other programs. Describe the event as much detailed as you can, like you are telling us a brief story. Use up all of the lines that they provided for you, the number of words is unlimited.

When posting pictures on social media please use our hashtag **#Auxiliaryoutreach**. In the description, please include your auxiliary number, city/town and the state. Let's flood social media and show why Arizona is the best in the west.

In 2024 the Buddy Poppy celebrated its 100th year, the VFW is currently recognizing 125 years and in 2025 the VFW National Home will celebrate its Centennial year. For 100 years the VFW National Home first served orphans, widows and disabled Veterans and now is a comprehensive support system for Veteran families. We have an opportunity to continue this mission and join in the festivities. January 7th will be the first celebration- did your Auxiliary send a card to be part of this historical event?

February 8th will be the "Gala" Celebration, a Black Tie/Formal event. 100th Anniversary Celebration Gala - VFW National Home Consider holding a "Black Tie" Valentine's event with a fundraising activity for the VFW National Home. Possibly a "blind auction" with the items "all dressed up" in black and white could add to the occasion. Mardi Gras is right around the corner- another potential date to hold a "Gala" event for the VFW National Home.

Goodbye 2024, a most hectic legislative year.

Welcome 2025! Let's make it a new beginning for Veterans!

This last year of 2024 was a wonderful time for Veteran legislation, yes you read that right. There were many Posts and Auxiliaries that hosted candidate Meet and Greets and Candidates Forum with all candidates being given equal opportunity. Many bills were passed both in the state and federal branches. Unfortunately,



we are still fighting for many and lost some battles like the Guard Act which would protect Veterans from attorneys (Claim Sharks).

Some bills made it through the House of representatives and are stalled in the Senate, the Major Richard Star Act, and the Elizabeth Dole Caregiver Act. **UPDATE:** ELIZABETH DOLE ACT PASSED DEC 17. The NDAA (National Defense Authorization Act) did pass with some major changes and possibly many changes coming from the new regime who take over January 20th.

Hopefully some of the changes will help Veterans get VA services faster. Investing in a range of national security initiatives, the legislation outlined key benefits for military personnel and strategic improvements across various infrastructures. Of interest is benefits for Arizona is investing in a range of national security initiatives, the legislation outlined key benefits for military personnel and strategic improvements across various infrastructures. Junior troops will receive a pay raise, expansion of basic needs allowance, more barracks and improvements for existing barracks and other quality-of-life provisions in the bill include allowing service members to seek some specialty health care without Tricare referrals, requiring pay for on-base child care workers to be competitive with the private sector, and making it easier for military spouses to transfer professional licenses between states.

We welcome the new 2025 Legislative members, incumbents and newly elected officials. Looking forward to seeing how the future of the committees will be formed with the addition and in some cases filling of positions which were lost in the 2024 elections. I hope your Auxiliaries sent a Christmas card or thank you for your support to those that are leaving office. Please take the time to send out Welcome cards to the elected officials that are coming back or are new. Include the new 2025 Priority Goals when you do. Again, welcome your elected in all offices including City, County, Commissions, State and Federal levels to meet with your members so we can continue to Advocate for our active duty, Veterans and their families to get the best possible help from our Country.

DOES ADVOCACY WORK?

Yes, it does!!

Back in 2021, an all-black woman Six Triple Eight Battalion received the Congressional Gold Medal. Starting in 2018, a group of Veterans, their families and a Senator from Iowa presented a bill to award the 855-member battalion the Congressional Gold Medal. They were advised there was no way it would happen, and in 2020 COVID hit but in 2021-22 the VFW and Auxiliaries and their families with encouragement from the legislative chairs in the Auxiliary nationwide started writing letters. Well, with letters coming from Arizona and the numerous ones from other states, that bill passed. WOW, less than 4

years, with being told probably wouldn't happen, the voices were heard. I was privileged, along with 3 other Auxiliary members to attend the awarding of the Congressional Gold Medal to Major Fannie McClendon at Tuskegee Airmen Museum.

Well, ASU University, just hosted the **Six Triple Eight movie premier**, **honoring the legacy of WWII women's battalion** which was attended by 104-year-old retired Maj. Fannie McClendon who has now been immortalized in a new World War II movie called Six Triple Eight about an all-black, all-female women's battalion she was part of. Don't worry if you missed the premier, it started showing on Netflix on December 21st.

ADVOCACY WORKS!! Don't be afraid to talk with your elected, write to them, attend meetings, host Meet and Greets, get the word to them about our Veteran family. The only thing we want to remember is to not endorse a particular candidate. Be **PROUD** of our ability to advocate for veterans - join the Action Corps Weekly. Encourage friends to join. They do not have to be a member of the VFW or Auxiliary to join this newsletter, which comes out once a week with updates on what is happening in Congress on bills affecting us.

Also, periodically, when there is an action alert on a bill coming up for vote they'll send an email requesting you help by a click of a button. Your voice is what they need to hear. Let's use this ability.

Wow where did this year go? January? What a busy month!



Have you talked to any of your members do they want to return to school in 2025?

- The **National Continuing Education Scholarship** deadline is February 15th. This grant application is sent directly to National Headquarters. Requirements are they have to be an auxiliary member, their spouse or child and at least 21 years of age. The amount granted is \$1250 and one person from each of the 4 conferences receives this. You can get all information on Malta. Fill out the application and submit an essay of 300 words or less.
- We also have our Arizona Educational Grant with a deadline of March 31st where one winner will receive \$1000 to a college or vocational school. Requirements for this one is Applicant MUST be a member of an Arizona VFW Auxiliary and at least 18 years of age. This is not for their spouse or children unless they are also members of the Auxiliary. This is a good membership tool as maybe the kids do not realize they can become members at the age of 16. Talk to the colleges, Foundation Coordinators, and see if any of the students might be able to join the Auxiliary under their grandparents or parents or even their brothers or sisters.
- Next is the **VFW Auxiliary Merit Scholarship.** This is for those students that have it all together. They must be related to a member of the VFW or the Auxiliary They must have their transcripts for grades 9 through 12, all

letters of recommendations, articles on their activities in their community such as school and church, listings of their employment, a copy of their college or vocational school entrance letter, and a biography about themselves. All this in a binder with sheet protectors sent to me before March 31st.

Remember we still have the **Young American Patriotic Arts Contests** both in 3D and 2D. These are open to all students in $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade.

- Are you struggling to get entries for the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest and the 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest?
- Would your Auxiliary be interested in sponsoring student entries from unaffiliated Posts?



PARs (Program Activity Report)

Our Website, <u>VFWAUXAZ.ORG</u>, contains the Google form to be used for your regular reporting. This is the only form being used this year! You can find the form behind log

in/program activity report. This is also where you can find the tracking sheet each month. Please take the time to look at the tracking sheet to make sure you Auxiliary's PARs are being recorded.

Please remember that in order to be considered for the Outstanding Auxiliary Award, your Auxiliary must turn in 12 PAR reports.

We have made your reporting so very simple; it can be done in a matter of minutes! It is a new year and Program Activity Reports (PARs) are so very important!

This is the monthly or quarterly report every Auxiliary sends to provide numbers to the Department of Arizona, then, National, starting every year in April. Why are these numbers so important?

All these numbers are important because they demonstrate our Mission to

support our Veterans and their families through our Programs. Every Donation, act of charity, Fund Raiser, Patriotic Festivity, etc., is what we need so desperately to hear about. When we compile all these numbers, they affect our ability to represent our Veterans and their families in the legislature to get and keep what is owed to them in Benefits, Support and Understanding.

Here are some examples that should be reported on your regular PAR:

- Providing Flag Education, Patriotism, POW/MIA and Star Family Recognition
- Supporting local Community Groups (hours and number of members)
- Poppy Distribution and Displays and National Home Education and Fund Raising
- Regular Newsletters or Emails to your Members as well as Mentoring Projects
- Members who regularly assist Veterans and/or their families with rides to the doctor, grocery shopping, well care visits, etc.
- Hospital work or donations, including Honors Escort Education
- Membership recruitment, retention, and appreciation
- Special Recognition Events
