PARs (Program Activity Report)

Our Website, <u>VFWAUXAZ.ORG</u>, contains the Google form to be used for your regular reporting. This is the only form being used this year! You can find the form behind log

in/program activity report. This is also where you can find the tracking sheet each month. Please take the time to look at the tracking sheet to make sure you Auxiliary's PARs are being recorded.

Please remember that in order to be considered for the Outstanding Auxiliary Award, your Auxiliary must turn in 12 PAR reports.

We have made your reporting so very simple; it can be done in a matter of minutes! It is a new year and Program Activity Reports (PARs) are so very important!

This is the monthly or quarterly report every Auxiliary sends to provide numbers to the Department of Arizona, then, National, starting every year in April. Why are these numbers so important?

All these numbers are important because they demonstrate our Mission to support our Veterans and their families through our Programs. Every Donation, act of charity, Fund Raiser, Patriotic Festivity, etc., is what we need so desperately to hear about. When we compile all these numbers, they affect our ability to represent our Veterans and their families in the legislature to get and keep what is owed to them in Benefits, Support and Understanding.

Here are some examples that should be reported on your regular PAR:

- Providing Flag Education, Patriotism, POW/MIA and Star Family Recognition
- Supporting local Community Groups (hours and number of members)
- Poppy Distribution and Displays and National Home Education and Fund Raising
- Regular Newsletters or Emails to your Members as well as Mentoring Projects
- Members who regularly assist Veterans and/or their families with rides to the doctor, grocery shopping, well care visits, etc.
- Hospital work or donations, including Honors Escort Education
- Membership recruitment, retention, and appreciation
- Special Recognition Events
- Assisting the VFW with Voice of Democracy and Patriot Pen Scholarships
- Donations and Fund Raisers for Scholarships (all)
- Any assistance or donations for Veterans and their families
- Books donated for Youth and support provided for "Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue" and Illustrating American Contests for Youth

This is not a complete listing of things to report, just a short listing to keep us from forgetting to report EVERYTHING!

Auxiliary Treasurers! Starting July 1, any new Annual Member applications must include a check for \$15 – National \$10 and Department Dues \$5. Life member fees will not change. Any new annual member applications received after December 20, must include the increase dues amount.... see below.

DEPARTMENT DUES GO UP TO \$10 STARTING JANUARY 1, 2025

Auxiliary Treasurers! Starting January 1, any new Annual Member applications must include a check for \$20 (National Dues \$10, Department Dues \$10)

Welcome to all the new Secretaries and Treasurers and welcome back to those who are continuing in those offices! I look forward to working with all of you.

The first thing the Secretaries and Treasurers need to do is log into MALTA:

- Secretaries need to confirm that meeting information is correct
- Treasurers need to confirm that dues amount is correct remember dues increase above
- Secretaries need to confirm that the current 2024-2025 officer information is correct. If not, make the corrections. Changes to Treasurer must go thru Department so let me know if I need to make that change for you.

Here are some quick reminders for new and continuing officers:

- Auxiliaries send me a copy of your quarterly Audit Reports as soon as they are accepted by the Auxiliary
- Districts send me a copy of the minutes of every District Meeting AND a copy of the accepted Audit Reports
- Auxiliaries Process donations to National Cancer Aid & Research, National Home Health & Happiness, National Patriotic Art, National Continuing Education and National President's Special Project – using MALTA, Make a Gift. Those donations will be debited directly from the Auxiliary account
- Donations to the VFW National Home Arizona House should be sent directly to the VFW National Home
- New Life Memberships to the National Home and other donations should be sent directly to the VFW National Home
- Donations to Arizona Department Scholarship Fund should be sent directly to VFW Auxiliary Dept of Arizona, 326 E. Burrows St., Tucson AZ 85704

We are not creating a Department Roster this year but using a feature in MALTA to create the roster.

Asst. Secretary Chrissy Harlan will be doing that and posting to the Arizona Department website – <u>vfwauxaz.org.</u>

The National website – <u>vfwauxiliary.org</u> aka MALTA and the Department website – <u>vfwauxaz.org</u> are two completely different resources. The National website is your resource for all things National, the Department website is for all things related to Department. If you can't find what you're looking for i.e. Project Report form or Project Activity Report, those are reports that are special to Arizona, so they can only be found on the Department website.

Member Involvement Trainings will be starting again soon. We hope to have a

separate day of trainings for Secretaries, Treasurers and Trustees in conjunction with the MITs, so watch for the flyer.

I'm looking forward to National convention in Kentucky! Hope to see many of you there!

All officers! Please reach out to Department if you have any questions or problems. We are here to help you, but we can't help if we don't know there is a question or a problem.

August 9 – 14 VFW National Convention in Columbus, Ohio-day trips to the National Home.

This year the focus is not only on the 100 Year Celebration; it is on educating the public about the Buddy Poppy and National Home.

Centennial Life Memberships to the National Home are now available for \$100. For those Auxiliaries with an "Early Bird" Membership Program- consider giving away a Centennial Life Membership for the *new* Life or Convert-to-Life Members? The funds go directly back to the National Home, Arizona gains another National Home Life Member, it adds incentive to Convert to Life with the rising cost of an Annual Membership. Centennial Membership - VFW National Home

At the Department Convention Program kick-off, a packet of information was given to Auxiliary members. Included was a Thank You Card, Christmas Card, Birthday Card-idea builders for future projects. A check for \$100 could also be included in the "holiday" or birthday greetings, to recognize the 100 Years. Looking to the Amazon Wish List- at the various times of the year, the Auxiliary can support the requested items in time for back-to-school, 4H projects, individual household needs, and Christmas items.

Buddy Poppy- Did you know....\$.01 cent from every Buddy Poppy purchased goes back to the National Home? Put this into perspective- there are 6,000 VFW Posts. If every Post purchased the "minimal" 500 Buddy Poppies, that is \$30,000 for the National Home. If the Auxiliary supports purchasing Buddy Poppies from their Post, it is a win/win. The more purchased, the more money that is contributed passively to the National Home.

Did you need more reasons? An additional \$.01 goes to NVS- National Veterans Services to assist with Service Officer duties to our Veterans and \$1.5 cents from every Buddy Poppy purchased goes back to your Department. 500 Buddy Poppies purchased = \$7.50 back to the Department of Arizona.

In the National Convention Buddy Poppy Display Contest Rules, "Posts that purchase over 250,000 Buddy Poppies may have more than one display in a category", more than 250,000 Buddy Poppies? \$2500 to the National Home, \$2500 to NVS, \$3750 to their Department. Since the inception of the Buddy Poppy- more than 1 Billion have been distributed. Let's raise those numbers!

When it comes to reporting, "expound" on "We wrapped Buddy Poppies on all the silverware sets for the dinner"- Why? What was learned from that? What does the Buddy Poppy represent? Was it just used as a decoration? Or were Buddy Poppies added to the Patriotic Celebration table to "Honor the Dead by Helping the Living". Give the Buddy Poppy the recognition it deserves as a symbol of those who gave their lives for our freedom and democracy.

Things to remember as we start the New Year -

- 1. We are a team, it's not up to one person to do any one job. Work as a team, include the post as well, more will get done.
- 2. Vote on things the auxiliary wants to do. It's not up to just the President to decide what is to be done.
- 3. Treat people the way you want to be treated; you never know if someone is having a bad day. Be respectful.
- 4. When receiving emails, don't click reply all unless told to do so. Don't forward it to people it was already sent to.
- 5. If you are an officer or thinking of becoming one, read the duties in your podium book, ask questions, read Building on the Auxiliary Foundation.
- 6. Communication, Communication, Communication.
- 7. Look at the resources behind Malta.

Suggestions to be successful not necessarily in any particular order-

- 1. Within the first 3 months form a committee to look over the standing rules and make suggestions.
- 2. Have the members write down 2 to 3 things they would like to see the auxiliary do then talk about them, then act on them.
- 3. Share information with everyone e.g. All members are encouraged to attend Fall and Winter conferences as well as Department convention and the CofA's (counsel of administration). Any member can attend Western Conference and Mid-Year conference.
- 4. Make sure to have a welcome packet for new members. Sit with them after they have looked at it to answer any questions.
- 5. Give good job awards out. Any member can give them like the person who saw them doing a good job.
- 6. Ask the post what you can do to help them.

Legislative Connie Hargreaves

What an exciting time for Legislation for our Veterans!



With this being a Presidential election year there is a lot of focus on Veterans, the border, health issues and much more. The candidates are out in force, trying to garner your confidence and vote. Now is the time for the VFW and the VFW Auxiliary to advocate for Veterans and Veteran programs.

Have you heard of **VET THE VOTE?** Let's get our veterans and family members on board working polling sites and in the elections department. Check out https://vetthe.vote/ as all counties are in need of poll and election workers and many of these positions are paid. Veterans are well networked, easily mobilized and stand up to the call. Maricopa county alone

needs 3,000 poll workers with 2300 already on board.

Does advocating really work? Yes, it does. Before the last session of legislation ended in Arizona, we succeeded in getting the 25 million for a VA Home in Mohave County funded through 2028. **WOW!** The next step is to let the Veterans Administration know the ball is now in their court. With property available in Kingman to be donated, the elected officials must now show why this VA Home can be sustained and maintained. Everyone signing to have this project approved and started is of utmost importance in the coming months. Please sign that you wish the VA Home to move forward in Mohave County. If you wish a copy of this signature in support of form reach out to me at tlc3conniet@yahoo.com and I will be happy to email it to you.

The first deadline for returning this form to me with signatures is July 1th, another deadline will be determined after that meeting with VA Admin representatives.

A new Fisher House in Phoenix was also approved before the legislative session ended and work on Claim Sharks will again be raised in the next session, this is to lay groundwork on charges for the Veteran to receive proper compensation and that the attorneys are accredited and know Veteran procedures. Tom Judd already has "Model Legislation" to streamline and protect our Veterans and their families.

Please take the time to check on local debates, meet and greet and anything else happening in your area regarding your candidates both local, state and federal. Host a meet and greet, a candidate forum, encourage your members to reach out to the candidates and promote.

Remember when advocating for Veterans the Do's and Don'ts: **DO's**

- Attend candidate town hall meetings and other events and ask candidates where they stand on our issues.
- Set up voter registration drives /Get Out the Vote Campaigns on the local level.
- Provide carpool service on Election Day to help the elderly and disabled get to the voting booth.
- Support and work for your favorite candidates as an individual voting constituent.
- Wear your VFW cap at public events such as town halls, rallies, forums, or debates.

DON'Ts

- Don't endorse candidates on behalf of the VFW National Organization, Department, District or Post.
- Don't wear your VFW cap when actively campaigning for a candidate, such as soliciting donations or knocking on doors asking people to pledge their vote for a candidate.

Welcome to the 2024-2025 Scholarship Program!

I am JaNice Robertson. Life member of VFW Auxiliary 769 in Quartzsite AZ, District 1 Auxiliary President, and Department of Arizona Scholarship chairman. I hope we all know that the first Scholarships we work on would be the **Voice of Democracy** (theme is "Is America Today Our Forefathers' Vision?") and the **Patriots Pen** (theme is "My Voice in America's Democracy?"). These are the VFW's scholarships but as we all know the Auxiliaries work just as hard in promoting these scholarships. Both are due to the VFW by October 31St, 2024.

But we as an Auxiliary have 2 contests that seem to get very little participation. One is a National scholarship that is due February 15th, 2025. It is: **Continuing Education Scholarship** – This scholarship is for our members and their spouse and children.

What makes a member qualified for this scholarship?

A member must have been a member for one (1) year by the application submission.

 Applicants must be in financial need to continue/return to college or vocational/technical/trade schools.

Must be 21 years of age by February 15, 2025.

Applications can be found in MALTA Member Resources or ask your Department Scholarships Chairman. (ME!) Deadline to get the application into National Headquarters by February 15, 2025. There will be one (1) winner from each of our four (4) Conferences. This scholarship is worth \$1,250 for each Conference. This one has its challenges as we are going up against everyone in our Western Conference. The person has to be a member or a spouse or child of a member that has been a member for at least 1 year. Very specific rules. And they send the application directly to National in Kansas City. So, for our Auxiliaries we do not really get to track this one, but we do need to talk to all of our members to see if we have anyone that qualifies and encourage them to participate.

The other one is **Arizona's Educational Grant**. One Educational Grant of \$1,000 will be awarded to the first-place winner. The Department of Arizona Auxiliary is pleased to present a \$1,000 grant to assist members who wish to

further their education by pursuing a college degree or a career direction at a vocational or technical school.

Applicant must be a current member of an Arizona VFW Auxiliary AND must be 18 years of age or older.

This one is much easier to apply for as it is for Arizona members only and they must be at least 18 years of age. Go out to the colleges, vocational schools, and trade schools. They may not know they are eligible to be a member. So now you are recruiting membership as well as helping them with the possibility of a grant. Talk to your members, maybe they have thought that they would like to continue their education but did not have enough funds. This one is due to me by April 1st, 2025.

So, you have the year to help me get these grants and scholarships promoted. These 2 opportunities have been so neglected in the past. I hate to see the funds just sit there.
