The following information has been put out by the National VFW. If your Auxiliary can help in any way, please do so.

"Earlier today I met with representatives from the Departments of Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, and Tennessee to disseminate



information on the process for requesting Disaster Relief Assistance. Over the course of the day, we here at National HQ dusted off our disaster relief tactics, techniques, and procedures to restart our support mechanisms.

Similar to the disaster that occurred in Maui last year, the aftermath of Hurricane Helene is going to take a long time to overcome. Reports from the American Red Cross is that they're gearing up to provide aid in the Ashville, NC area for at least a year. Finally, I consulted with the Commander-in-Chief about our planned way ahead and he's given me the green light to execute.

Soon you will be seeing our call to action over social media and on our national website in support of the affected areas. Please help us to direct all parties interested in providing financial assistance to aid in the recovery efforts to visit our secure site at www.vfw.org/relief to make their tax-deductible donations. Feel free to broadcast the link to donate far and wide. For those who prefer to send in checks, that information is located at that link as well.

Lastly, the Department of North Carolina is working to identify Posts around the vicinity of the affected areas for food, clothing, and supplies to be sent for distribution. In these types of situations, water, toiletries, and sanitizers are always needed. Clothing and shoes run a close second. We will get that information out to you as soon as we obtain it. More to follow in that regard.

Here are some easy steps that will help you accomplish that by using this **FREE** App- Pic Collage whether you have an Android or iPhone.

Step 1: Download the App

Step 2: Open the App

Step 3: Select photo & Video (on top of screen)

Step 4: Choose photos: Select up to 6 photos you want to use

Step 5: Import photos: Tap the Check-mark icon in the top right corner that has

the number of pictures that you selected to import the photos

Step 6: Suggested layouts—Pic Collage will automatically create a collage using the auto setting.

You can also explore different collage options (sizes/suggested/grids at the top if you would like)

Step 7: Select your option

Step 8: Click the gray area around the collage

You can also play with the backgrounds (change the color/design of the border)

Step 9: Click done button (top right corner)

Step 10: Click save to library/gallery (middle of screen)

The pictures will go to your photos on the phone, and you are done. It's that simple.

the National Home, September 7, 2024, delivered by National VFW Auxiliary Chaplain, Kim Harney: "Lord, we thank you for allowing us to assemble here today for the twelfth Celebrating America's Freedom Event. The National Home is a place near and dear to our hearts, as it was our first-ever continuing

Program and one we strive to see succeed for many years to come. For nearly a century Auxiliary members have regularly bowed their heads in prayer for the children and families of the National Home, asking God to bestow upon them the safety, stability and serenity that all of His children deserve, and we ask that those in attendance do so again as we celebrate being gathered together here today."

Serenity is the perfect word to describe what visiting the National Home was like. 300 strangers touring the campus, moving from building to building on a planned scavenger hunt, in the midst, 2 little girls sit side by side on a playground with not a care in the world.

The biggest take-away; the people. We see Mr. Wilson, Sue Alverson, Megan, Brian on the cover of a magazine or during a Zoom meeting or visiting National Convention. Meeting them at the National Home setting was so very moving. Real people, much larger than their magazine photo, so dedicated- so giving. If ever the opportunity arises, put it on a bucket list. The National Home is so very inspirational. The artifacts are amazing. The very grainy video of the Children's Fire Department from the 1983 "That's Incredible" taping. Every wall in the museum is worth gleaning. All made possible by donations from **YOU**.

The 100 Challenge: The VFW National Home has evolved from being so much more than an orphanage or home for widows and disabled Veterans. From the idea of Amy Ross, who passed before ever seeing her vision a reality- 100 years later is still serving Veteran Families. To honor this 100 Year Celebration- before January 1st, every Auxiliary that reports something to recognize the National Home's 100 Years will be put in a drawing for a Centennial Life Membership (to be drawn at Winter conference). Seems I am always playing catch up. I have received a few reports and reading them is always enlightening. You, brothers and sisters, do good work. However, though I have a vivid

imagination, a bit more detail would be good. Date? How many went? How many patients did you interact with? Was it merely a delivery or a visit. And each entity you visit should be reported separately. Each date you go should be separate. The more work we do and the better we report equals more power for our voice. I even noted on a report that two members volunteered at a facility. There should be a report and who? Where? How many miles did you rack up round trip? Total visit time? Just a couple more minutes can add up to valuable data. If you do the report the same day or asap so much the better. And of course, the awards would come from the details.

Your last chance to listen to candidates, your last chance to find out what veteran bills were not passed, which ones our representatives did or did not vote for and your last chance to find out why. Are the candidates concerned about veterans or how they intend to help our veterans, our homeless, are they coming up with programs that help the veteran and family to transition to civilian life, help with mental and suicide thoughts?

Call their offices, write them letters, visit their websites, and attend town hall meetings and campaign stops. It's not too late to have a "Coffee with a Candidates" at your Post and invite the candidates and community? How about holding a legislative luncheon at your Post and inviting the candidates? Please check with candidates to see who may be in the area, make sure you have one or two candidates at the event.

Don't know what bills the VFW is advocating for, check out Action Corps Weekly and while your there is you have not signed up for this publication that comes to your email every Monday, please do so while you are there. Download the VFW Priority goals, in fact have your quartermaster order them to give to your candidates and our current elected officials. They are free with \$5 shipping.

This you receive in the mail, if you haven't contacted your county election department or your local library.

If you're not registered to vote, you need to register by October 7^h. You can register at County offices, Recorder Office, ADOT, many libraries and other nonprofits will have voter registration forms.

Stop by local politician offices and speak to the office staff or you can check your area for upcoming town halls or forums. Early ballots get mailed out October 7th.

Our veterans' programs and benefits depend on who wins elections and not just our representatives in Congress but in Arizona also. Be pro-active, be informed, vote with a veteran in mind. It is up to our elected officials to listen to us the voter, the veteran, the family member or the active-duty service men and women to vote in the best VETERAN representative we can. The person

who will listen, read, research and get the bill written in a correct and accurate form so it can move forward to the floors of the House or Senate, then to the committees involved in the needs of the bill and return it to the floors of the Legislature. We need to hire the person to stand up for our Veterans, their benefits and their programs who will help them and their family now and in the future.

For those who will be voting in person, how about organizing a transportation pool on election day? We must assist our veterans with their right to vote all we can, whether through our Post, or individually. There is still time to check with https://vetthe.vote/ to see if your county needs people to work the elections. Every county has different needs and different positions that need filling. You can also call your County Elections department. This can be in the elections department or at polling location.

PARs (Program Activity Report)

Our Website, <u>VFWAUXAZ.ORG</u>, contains the Google form to be used for your regular reporting. This is the only form being used this year! You can find the form behind log

in/program activity report. This is also where you can find the tracking sheet each month. Please take the time to look at the tracking sheet to make sure you Auxiliary's PARs are being recorded.

Please remember that in order to be considered for the Outstanding Auxiliary Award, your Auxiliary must turn in 12 PAR reports.

We have made your reporting so very simple; it can be done in a matter of minutes! It is a new year and Program Activity Reports (PARs) are so very important!

This is the monthly or quarterly report every Auxiliary sends to provide numbers to the Department of Arizona, then, National, starting every year in April. Why are these numbers so important?

All these numbers are important because they demonstrate our Mission to support our Veterans and their families through our Programs. Every Donation, act of charity, Fund Raiser, Patriotic Festivity, etc., is what we need so desperately to hear about. When we compile all these numbers, they affect our ability to represent our Veterans and their families in the legislature to get and keep what is owed to them in Benefits, Support and Understanding.

Here are some examples that should be reported on your regular PAR:

- Providing Flag Education, Patriotism, POW/MIA and Star Family Recognition
- Supporting local Community Groups (hours and number of members)
- Poppy Distribution and Displays and National Home Education and Fund Raising
- Regular Newsletters or Emails to your Members as well as Mentoring Projects
- Members who regularly assist Veterans and/or their families with rides to the doctor, grocery shopping, well care visits, etc.
- Hospital work or donations, including Honors Escort Education
- Membership recruitment, retention, and appreciation
- Special Recognition Events
- Assisting the VFW with Voice of Democracy and Patriot Pen Scholarships
- Donations and Fund Raisers for Scholarships (all)
- Any assistance or donations for Veterans and their families
- Books donated for Youth and support provided for "Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue" and Illustrating American Contests for Youth

This is not a complete listing of things to report, just a short listing to keep us from forgetting to report EVERYTHING!
