November and December are going to be busy with special days. We have Thanksgiving, Pearl Harbor Day and Bill of Rights Day (12/7), Hanukkah (12/14-21), Kwanzaa (12/26-1/1), and Christmas. November is also Native American Heritage Month and National Caregivers Month. For Buddy Poppy you must describe your outstanding activity/event with your VFW Post to educate your community about the VFW Buddy Poppy. For the National Home you must describe your outstanding activity/event that creates awareness and education of eligibility and who qualifies for help from the National Home and promoting it within their Department to help Veterans and their families. Each must be mailed by March 31, 2026, for judging.

### Keep working on our Department Goals:

<u>Buddy Poppy</u>: Order your Poppies now. The Comrades have to order them, but the Auxiliary can help purchase them. Keep a Buddy Poppy "kit" with you to distribute. WEAR YOUR BUDDY POPPY EVERYWHERE. People notice, so be prepared to educate. Brainstorm ideas for your Buddy Poppy Display Entry at Convention.

National Home: Get the information on eligibility criteria out to your members and the public. Make business cards with the Helpline (800-313-4200) and the QR code. Buy your Life Membership NOW. The price goes up to \$100 on January 1st. Until then you can purchase a Life membership for \$50 and a Centennial Membership for \$100. Purchase your Tribute Brick. If you want a Centennial Brick, go in with the Auxiliaries in your District. Support our Comrades goal of "Stocking the Store" to supply residents with needed store items. Western Conference Auxiliaries and Comrades are collecting together to purchase a bench in The National Home Memorial Garden and appreciate our support. Currently 10 homes have been vacated and 32 homes are occupied. The Washington House had a great success story – the family was accepted and graduated in just 7 months!

Invite Youth Groups to help with filling boxes for our Troops, those in need, holiday food drives, placing Wreaths at a Wreaths Across America Ceremony (Dec. 13), coloring wreaths for Veteran or hospital patient shut-ins. A note from a child to help someone feel not forgotten will be 2-fold rewarded.

Remember to encourage youth to participate in the "Illustrating America Contest" <u>illustrating america art (5).pdf</u> This contest is for students in grades K - 8 and is a great way to introduce future Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest entries. Speak with the school Art teacher if available and see if you can get them to include this contest into their curriculum by having students draw, paint or color a patriotic picture. Place Illustrating America contest applications at Art Stores or Libraries to reach a wider audience.

Please use the NEW Youth "Acts of Kindness Certificates" to show good deeds and acts of citizenship do not go unnoticed. Look for students that go out of their way to be kind and helpful. youth act of kindness cit (4).pdf

As always, carry the R.A.P. cards and a small American Flag pin with you so when you notice a child honoring a veteran or saluting a flag they may be rewarded on the spot. Positive reinforcement goes a long way.

Encourage involvement from an early age in all Auxiliary Programs. Help the Youth of today to remember the VFW Auxiliary as they grow- they may be the

members in our future ensuring our flag and patriotic holidays will be preserved.

### Veterans and Family Support November 2025

Recognizing signs of distress, offering to include someone, being willing to listen – may save a life.

The residual effects of the government shut down, articles claiming Veterans are taking advantage of the system, and pride- we have been trained to be proud and problem solvers, may leave long lasting, unseen scars.

How can we as Auxiliary, Veteran, Caregivers, Family, Community help to ease this anxiety?

Stealing from Crystal's Challenge- \*Make a business card with helpline numbers and your contact information- include the Veterans and Family Support link on the back 2025 2026 veterans family.pdf (MALTA under V&FS)

Invite people to join you at the Post for the holiday program or offer to bring them a plate or something back from the activity. Inviting someone to a gathering- with no expectations- could make all the difference.

Do a Buddy Check- never underestimate the power of a hot pumpkin pie or fresh baked batch of cookies. Even if it is not their favorite, the fact you thought of them could save a life.

Little ones will be out of school- therefore, potentially without a meal. Check in on neighbors, be informed about the VFW National Home eligibility, offer to share your holiday dinner.

Holiday cards from Youth, little-hand designed cards or construction paper stockings with words of gratitude, glue and glitter are genuinely appreciated.

What it boils down to, we wish each other well- at times we need to take it one step further and go beyond our comfort to in-person ensure others know we care.
