

First Quarter 2023 (Jan – March) Audits – Must be completed and approved by the Auxiliary by May 31 with a copy to me by June 1. That is the magic date that I have to report to the National Secretary which Auxiliaries are in arrears for audits and will not be allowed to vote at the National Convention. Believe me that I will nag, nag, nag you before I let that happen.

2023 National Convention Delegates – must be elected at April meeting and input by the Auxiliary Secretary between May 1 and May 31. That delay may cause you to forget to enter them. If your Auxiliary does not have Delegates entered by May 15, expect to get that dreaded phone call from me.

2023-2024 Installation Reports – These must be input into MALTA by the 2022-2023 Secretary by June 30th. If you need assistance, call or email Asst. Secretary Chrissy Harlan or me and we'll help you. But that is a very hard deadline! No exceptions! Installation Reports are below and can be found on the Department webpage - www.vfwauxaz.org behind member log in under Secretary.

2023-2024 Bonds for President and Treasurer – Every Auxiliary must have their 2023 – 2024 Bonds in place by July 31. While the dates overlap, the bonds do not. If your Auxiliary is not bonded by July 20, I'll be nagging you to get it done.

2023-2024 DEPARTMENT Delegates and Alternates Instructions

Review Bylaws Sec 304

Delegates and Alternates to the Department Meetings and Convention shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the Department Convention

Auxiliaries should elect their Delegates and Alternates at their April or May meeting.

Number of Delegates and Alternates

National Bylaws state that the number of Delegates and Alternates may be set forth differently in the Department Bylaws. Department of Arizona Bylaws call for one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election.

EXAMPLE:

On the night Delegates and Alternates are to be elected, MALTA shows the Auxiliary has 102 members in good standing.

102 divided by 10 = 10.2 (.2 is fraction thereof and so you round up to 11)

Therefore the Auxiliary would elect 11 Delegates and 11 Alternates

Election

Delegates and Alternates are elected by the members – they are NOT appointed. Most Auxiliaries have more Delegates/Alternates than attend Auxiliary meetings. Note that members do not have to be present to be elected as a Delegate or Alternate. The membership should consider those members who may not be able to attend Auxiliary meetings but do attend the Department Convention. All Delegates and Alternates must be members in good standing of that Auxiliary (life members or current annual members).

Department Composition Members

The Auxiliary President has his/her own vote at the Department Convention and should be listed at the bottom of the form AND as an Alternate in the right column.

The National District Council Member, any Department Officer and Past Department Presidents, that are members of your Auxiliary have their own vote at Department Convention. They should be listed at the bottom of the form and should be considered for election as an Alternate. They will need to notify the Credentials Chairman if they are voting as a Delegate or voting their own vote.

If the Auxiliary President is the only Delegate or Alternate at the Department Convention, he/she may choose to vote as a Delegate rather than as Auxiliary President. In the example above, the Auxiliary is entitled to 11 votes (each Delegate has one vote) plus the President's vote. But if the President chooses to vote as a Delegate (which he/she may do if all of the Delegates are not present) he/she would cast 11 votes instead of just the President's vote.

 PRINT OR TYPE ALL INFORMATION – It is acceptable to print the list and attach it to the Delegate form.

Submit to the Department Secretary AND the Department Credentials Chairman.

The Auxiliary Secretary is responsible for sending the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the Department Secretary and the Department Credentials Chairman. This list should be sent immediately after election.

Fees

Delegate Fees are \$4.00 based on number of Delegates the Auxiliary is entitled to, plus \$4 for each Department composition members.

Example: The Auxiliary is entitled to and elects 35 Delegates (\$140), plus the Auxiliary President (\$4.00), plus the District President is a member of that Auxiliary (\$4.00) plus there is one Department Officer (\$4.00) and one Past Department President(\$4.00) that are members of that Auxiliary.

The Auxiliary Secretary would give a copy of the Delegate List to the Treasurer and request a check for \$156).

Arrearages / Audits

Any Auxiliary in arrears for District Dues or which has failed to submit quarterly audits through December 31, 2022 shall be deprived representation at the Department Convention and shall not be allowed to vote.

Term


Delegates/Alternates serve for one (1) full year from the date of election to the next election.

Absence

If the Auxiliary President is absent or not in the room, the Auxiliary Sr. Vice President or in their absence, the Auxiliary Jr. Vice President may function as the Department Composition member.

The Legislation Year in Review- in considering what to write about for the April newsletter- the VFW Legislation Conference has passed, November had elections, the PACT Act passed, the State of Arizona

passed Proposition 130 the % of Veteran disability off their property taxes – and the "Talking Points" for this year's conference: Protecting Veterans from Predatory Claims especially now associated with the passing of the PACT Act, Economic Opportunity vs Veteran Suicide and Chapter 61- the Major Richard Star Act- it has been quite a year. <u>Legislative Priorities - VFW</u>

On VFW.org, under Advocacy and Legislation, along the right- hand side, lists a column of contacting your representatives; as well as all the VFW has done in Legislation since 1917 - including helping to establish the VA Priority Goals, the "how to" become involved, "Action Corps Weekly", "Know the Issues" and "View Current Legislation" which, as this is being written, has changed from 2 bills being watched to 6 and now 9. Interestingly, bills relating to Veteran disability/retirement pay and suicide prevention.

Looking to VFW Legislative Victories <u>VFWLegislativeVictories.pdf</u> (<u>azureedge.net</u>) - it shows having passed in 2022, Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas SERVICE Act- toxic exposure led to stage 4 breast cancer – completely undiagnosed and in a unanimously approved vote- to provide breast cancer screenings to Veterans who served in burn pit and exposed to toxic substances areas.

Following the links, by going to www.GovTrack.US in the "Search" box and putting in S. 2102, the 117th Congress (the year just passed when this bill was voted) it is noted who introduced, the text of the bill, who supported (both Arizona Senators Kelly and Sinema) and a Google search brings up the case for more information.

From the Arizona Veteran Caucus March 8^h, several bills are being introduced for Veterans; HB2336 tuition for family members of posttraumatic stress related suicide, HB2589 for Military members already trained as medics to be able to transition that training to being an EMT/ Emergency Medical Technicians/Military Reciprocity. Another bill will include family members of National Guard service members killed in line of duty to receive the same benefits as other first responders. These can be tracked on AZLeg.gov.

It is never a bad idea to contact your representatives and let them know of your interest in Veteran Legislation issues, what is going on in your area, invite them to participate – that is how Senator Kelly's Staff members attended the Winter Conference Voice of Democracy luncheon- Kim Sloan asked! Which has continued to be an ongoing invitation to the Staff to participate in VFW and VFW Auxiliary events. By contacting your local representatives, your invitation will be directed to Staff Members who may best address your correspondence or event.

In closing, a year of apprehension of being completely overwhelmed in a field I knew nothing, unexpectedly this has been one of the most exciting Auxiliary Programs. Representatives are real people. As PDP Melody Judd stated early on- "They work for us!" (and you will not squeal like a school girl) "Stay focused on the issues and press for answers."

Remember, "VFW Action Corps Weekly" is not a crutch to be leaned on when you can't come up with anything else in Legislation. It is a "Tool" to be used as part of the Auxiliary kit to continue to be relevant in assisting Veterans, Military,

We welcome new Director LTC (ret) Dana Allmond.

The Arizona State Veterans Home in Flagstaff has opened. The number to call for admissions is 602-234-5678 and for employment call 602-781-7032. Veterans receiving over 70% VA compensation are free. It is not cheap to reside there, but payment assistance is available. Mohave County has a State Veterans Home coming within two years. Location has yet to be determined.

The Arizona Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) will be releasing brand new driver license and ID cards this March. The new design will include several new security features that help prevent counterfeit reproductions or fraudulent use. Current Drivers licenses are good until expired.

DVNF (Disabled Veterans National Foundation) is relaunching it's Grants to Provide Stability (GPS) program. GPS is a grant program for veterans who find themselves in temporary financial setback. DVNF can provide up to \$1,000 to help eligible veterans pay for rent or mortgage and essential utilities such as water or electricity. This program started on March 1st. Suicide and mental health is still a priority and if you watched any of the legislative conference at the beginning of March, you saw how much of our programs are based on advocacy for Veterans and their families and that not only are we here for our community, but our county, state and national needs. Loyalty Day (May 1)

Loyalty Day not only celebrates the loyalty Americans possess for their nation but also looks at the historic events that led to the formation of the U.S.A The first National Loyalty Day took place in 1921 during the First Red Scare — a time when America was struggling with the fear of far-left extremism including Bolshevism, due to real and imagined events. It is during this period of uncertainty that the day came into being and was initially celebrated as Americanization Day.

In 1955, Loyalty Day was recognized by the U.S. Congress since the country was facing a great threat in the form of the rise of communism. During this time, Congress felt it necessary to honor America and remind people of the loyalty they owe to the nation. In 1958, President Dwight D. Eisenhower declared the day a legal holiday to be celebrated with great fervor. According to the President, it was essential to observe a National Loyalty Day to look

back on the history of the country and understand how valuable the gift of freedom is. The basic motive behind the day is to awaken a sense of patriotism in all Americans.

UNITING TO COMBAT HUNGER (UTCH) GRANT - SPRING 2023

In 2018 the VFW joined forces with Humana to establish the Uniting to Combat Hunger (UTCH) campaign. As of October 2022, the initiative has raised the equivalent of more than 4 million meals to address food insecurity in America. To reward the efforts of VFW Posts and Auxiliaries that support the campaign, the VFW Foundation offers the Uniting to Combat Hunger Grant. Posts and Auxiliaries may qualify for an unrestricted grant by meeting the following criteria:

- For every \$1 raised by a VFW Post/Auxiliary to support Uniting to Combat Hunger, the VFW Foundation
 will provide a \$1 match in the form of an unrestricted grant to the VFW/Auxiliary Post. A minimum of
 \$500 must be raised to qualify for the matching grant. An applicant may receive up to \$1,500 in UTCH
 grant funding.
- For every pound of food donated to a food bank, food pantry or community kitchen, the VFW Foundation will provide a \$1 match. A minimum of 500 lbs. must be collected to qualify for the matching grant.
- For every \$1 spent on food purchased to support a food pantry ran by the Post or Auxiliary, the VFW will provide a \$1 match. A minimum of \$500 must be spent to qualify and the applicant must prove that the food pantry has been operating for at least one year and show that it is sustainable.

Donations of food and financial contributions to UTCH may be combined in the grant application. For example, a VFW Post or Auxiliary that donates \$500 and 500 pounds of food to a food bank could receive a \$1,000 grant.

While not required to do so, applicants are strongly encouraged to partner with their local Humana associate(s) on UTCH activities.

UTCH GRANT GUIDELINES

- UTCH grants are restricted to VFW Posts and Auxiliaries. Other VFW entities are not eligible to receive this
 grant. To qualify, a Post must be in good standing with the VFW National organization, meaning they have
 a fully completed election report on file, are not in financial arrears and are not on suspension.
- 2. Grants will be made to Posts or Auxiliaries for completing the following on or after July 1, 2022:
 - a. Making financial contributions to a local food bank, food pantry or community kitchen. If you donate to an organization that provides programs in addition to providing food, you must provide the VFW Foundation with a letter from them stating that your donation is restricted to their food pantry service. Applicants may alternatively donate through www.vfw.org/UTCH, or via check made out to VFW Foundation, designating UTCH in a cover letter or the memo portion of the check.
 - Donations of food may be made to any food bank, food pantry or community kitchen that
 provides meals or food to anyone seeking assistance regardless of their immutable
 characteristics or beliefs.
 - c. Purchasing food to distribute through an existing food bank operated by a Post or Auxiliary.
- Only a VFW Post or its Auxiliary may receive this grant. For example, if a Post receives this grant its Auxiliary may not, if an Auxiliary receives this grant the VFW Post may not.

VFW FOUNDATION

UNITING TO COMBAT HUNGER (UTCH) GRANT - SPRING 2023

- 4. The grant that the Post or Auxiliary receives from the Foundation may be utilized by the Post or Auxiliary for any purpose, so long as it is in accordance with VFW or Auxiliary by-laws. The maximum amount for a UTCH grant back to the Post or Auxiliary is \$1,500. A Post or Auxiliary may receive multiple grants during the year so long as the total amount awarded by the VFW Foundation does not exceed \$1,500.
- 5. This is a retroactive grant; applicants will submit their requests after their projects have been completed. VFW Posts and Auxiliaries must document financial contributions and volunteer hours; for example, a copy of the VFW Foundation receipt for the UTCH grant, photos or social media/news article screenshots of qualifying volunteer event, etc. The exact donation amount and number of volunteer hours must be specified on any such documentation. Supporting documentation must be provided at the time of submission.
- 6. The VFW Foundation reserves the right to make changes to the application procedure at any time.

Little Free Pantry Additional Funding Opportunity

The VFW Foundation will reimburse Posts/Auxiliaries for up to \$500 for constructing and establishing a little free food pantry at their Post home or local community center, providing food at no cost to the recipients. A Post/Auxiliary must provide receipts showing all expenses incurred in placing the pantry upon submitting their request. Please be advised that a grant awardee may receive no more than \$1,500 total in UTCH grant funding. For example, a Post could donate to a food bank totaling \$1,500 and receive \$500 for expenses incurred placing a little free pantry. However, if a Post donated \$1,500 to a local food bank, they could not receive any additional funding for also placing the little pantry. 


