We are about to hold our Winter Conference and are honored to have our National President Carla Martinez attending.

We will be honoring her with an Aisle of Flags on Friday evening at the USS Arizona

Memorial Gardens so remember to bring both your American flag and your Auxiliary Banner. President Carla will also be joining as many of us as possible, at the cemetery on Friday afternoon at 1 pm as we remember and salute our interred veterans with Flags and Flowers. It is such a moving experience to place those items on the grave of those who have served our country and thank them out loud for their service.

Wreaths Across America this year was phenomenal! There are more than 69,000 veteran graves in Arizona alone and Auxiliary members,

along with citizens of all ages, were out honoring our deceased veterans while placing a remembrance wreath on their final resting place and thanking them for their service.

It is awesome to see so much of what the members are doing across Arizona for both our scholarship participants and our communities this past month. From children's Christmas parties to food distributions for those in need to Christmas stockings for the homeless... OUTSTANDING!

You have done a wonderful job so far on membership, bringing our Department to 97.7% as of December 20, 2023. We need only 257 more statewide to reach 100%. That is quite a small number as our total membership last year of paid members was 11,175! Let's keep working on contacting not only the unpaid annual members, but also our lapsed members. I believe we can reach 100% by January 31st.

Keep reporting to the Program Chairmen on these wonderful events and sending your Program Activity Reports (PAR). Everything you do for our veterans, their families and our communities, helps our organization both grow and enhances how we are perceived by others.



AZ. The delivery was the result of several months of conversation and meetings with the Council of Nations, District 5 Auxiliary President/Auxiliary 10254 Treasurer Crystal McCarthy, Dept of AZ Auxiliary Americanism Chair Lori Schaeffler and Post 10254 Comrade John Johnson, who resides in Sells.

Mrs. Schaeffler arranged the donation from the extra wreaths at the Veterans Cemetary in Marana and Ms. McCarthy worked with the Reservation Veterans Center. Auxiliary members Nicci Pretti and April Kibler loaded wreaths and donated their time and resources to secure the delivery 45 miles to the Veterans Center where the cargo was unloaded in conjunction with the Tohono O'odham Fire Department Members. The Veterans Center hosted a ceremony on December 17 where they displayed the ceremonial wreaths and members spoke. This is the first time in the US that a Native Reservation has held a Wreaths Across America ceremony. We were blessed to have been a small part of making it happen.

ANNUAL MEMBERS

An Annual Member that has not paid their 2024 dues or converted to Life Member by December 31, 2023, is no



longer a member in good standing. Thank you to all the Auxiliaries that got their officers' dues paid. They are now able to remain in office. Thank you to all the members that reached out for assistance to pay their dues or convert to Life Member using MALTA.

MALTA

If an Annual Member wants to pay their dues or convert to Life Member and use MALTA – the name on the debit/credit card must match the name on the debit/credit card or they'll get stuck in the payment process. So, if a member calls you for help, you'll know that this could be the problem.

The new Accounting Program in MALTA has one area that the Treasurer's need to be aware of.

When you're entering a receipt or a disbursement, the program lets you put in a description i.e.

Income - John Doe Dues \$ 30.00

Disbursement - Jones Rental Chairs/Tables for Memorial Service \$100.00

But when you print out the monthly Treasurer's Report, the program does not show what that income or disbursement was for, so as Treasurer you'll still need to keep a record to supplement your Treasurer's Report and to provide to the Trustees for the audit.

DUES

MALTA has a new feature for showing annual dues amounts. Many Auxiliaries will be raising their dues to cover additional National dues which start with payments of 2025 dues. If the Auxiliary voted to raise their annual dues to \$40 (example) starting with 2025 dues year, the Treasurer can go into MALTA and change the new dues amount and the effective date. Then if an annual member logs into MALTA before that date, they will be charged the current amount, but if they log after the effective date, MALTA will charge them the updated amount.

OFFICIAL LOOK

Please see the diagram in the Bylaws Book of Instruction page 33 about the placement of the collar pins. I know you see VFW members wearing their collar pins at an angle. That is not the way that the Auxiliary is to place those pins if they are wearing the official blue blouse. The pins are to be place parallel to the bottom of the collar. If you are serving with the VFW on a color guard team and NOT wearing the official blouse, you should wear the pins as instructed by the Color Guard Captain.

DEPARTMENT BYLAWS

The Department President has appointed a committee to review and present proposed changes to the Department Bylaws at Department Convention. One of the proposed changes is an increase to Department Dues for annual members and Department Members at Large. A copy of the proposed revised Bylaws will be posted to the website and distributed to the District Presidents at the upcoming Council of Administration meeting for discussion. They will not be voted on until Department Convention, but in the interest of transparency, this is something that we believe should be shared in advance.

What an amazing WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA DAY we had across our state. 12 new locations were added bringing our state to 71 locations, I do not have the exact number laid but I will know that final total by Winter Conference. Great job everyone honoring our Veterans. For the first time

Native American Veterans were honored on the reservation. In September, District 5 President Crystal McCarthy and I met with Native American Vet Center in Sells AZ. We did so well with donations that we were able to donate them 375 wreaths so they could see what the program means to the families. We hope that next year they will be their own location. One of my friends tagged me on FaceBook that her grandfather was honored with a Wreath literally in the middle of nowhere. So, it does make an impact to the families, Makes all the hard work worth it for the families.

This is why we and you should support POW/MIA -Answers do come for the families. Don't give up! Many of you have heard Bill and I talk many times about the Prisoner of War/Missing in Action bracelet we wear of Capt. Ronald Forrester. Karoni (our good friend and his daughter) spoke at our fall conference couple years ago.

He was part of Operation Linebacker on 12/27/72 better known as the

"Christmas Bombings", that did get both sides to the negation table. Capt. Forrester and Jim Chipman were shot down and declared Missing in Action. Earlier this year Jim Chipman was identified and laid to rest in Utah 11/11/23.

On 12/08/23 my dear friend called me to tell me that morning she received the call from USMC Casualty Dept letting her know that they positively identified her Daddy.

If you read VFW Action Corp, this was in the 12/18 edition: Marine Corps Capt. Ronald W. Forrester, 25, of Odessa, Texas, was assigned to Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 533, Marine Attack Group 12, 1st Marine Air Wing. He was killed in action on Dec. 27, 1972. Services in his home state will be 2/2/24 in Austin TX. His Interment will be at Arlington when a date becomes available in the summer.

The Flag Code, which formalizes and unifies the traditional ways in which we give respect to the flag, also contains specific instructions on how the flag is not to be used.

They are:

- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal. The flag should not be used as a drapery, or for covering a speaker's desk, draping a platform, or for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind. The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
- When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag, it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously. The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary. When a flag is so worn, it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.

Have you thought about asking your community to attend flag

retirement and how to properly retire a flag? Many people I have spoken to didn't know there is a proper way to do so. How about your Cub Scouts? Many need this badge but they need to be asked to assist you. Maybe your Auxiliary could help out with the Flag Retirement ceremony that Derek is hosting in Coolidge on Jan 3rd. Case management is a collaborative process of assessment, planning, facilitation, care coordination, evaluation, and advocacy for options and services to meet an individual's and family's comprehensive needs through communication and available resources to promote quality, costeffective outcomes. That number is 800-313-4200. Don't forget your PAR reports, have you promoted VFW National Home, their Helpline, purchased Life memberships, Tribute Bricks. These should be done monthly.

Our Auxiliary members were busy distributing Buddy Poppies these past two months; please get your program reports in and fill out your PAR reports. Did you do a Poppy drive, with or without your Post, how many Poppies were distributed and finally whether you are participating in the Poppy display contest. Fill out your PAR and send in a Program report so you can receive a National Certificate.

Ways to complete a poppy distribution.

- Valentine cards with a poppy included.
- Have youth color Valentine poppy for veterans.
- Send with a Birthday card, get well, thank you or thinking of you card.
- Set on your dining table with canister, wrap your silverware and use a Buddy Poppy around them.

These two scholarships are only part of the opportunities the Scholarship Program has to offer, and we must be keeping our attention on the deadlines for the upcoming awards. Are your calendars marked for the important dates? Our National Scholarship Ambassador Tina Hicks shared not dates with us but helpful tips on reaching applicants in her blog which you can access here.

- Continuing Education Scholarship The application must be received at National Headquarters by February 15, 2024.
 \$1,250 will be awarded to an applicant in each of the four Conferences.
- Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest Entries must be to the local VFW Auxiliary by March 31, 2024. There will be scholarships awarded in the amounts of \$500 to \$15,000.
- **3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest** Entries must be to the **local VFW Auxiliary by March 31, 2024**. There will be scholarship awards in the amounts of \$500 to \$2,500.

Additionally, Arizona offers two Scholarships each year.

- Arizona VFW Auxiliary Merit Scholarship Entries must be received by the Department Scholarship Chairman by April 1, 2024. There will be one scholarship awarded in the amount of \$1,000.
- Arizona VFW Auxiliary Educational Grant Entries must be received by the Department Scholarship Chairman by April 1, 2024. There will be one Grant awarded up to the amount of \$1,000.

Auxiliary 549- Esperanza En Escalante- transitional housing for Veterans- supports them with necessary requested foods, school supplies, expectant mother supplies.

Auxiliary 1433 contributed a tote of items for recreational therapy to the Arizona State Veterans Home in Phoenix.

Arizona Purple Star pilot program- 4 schools supporting Luke Air Force Base military families. <u>Arizona Purple Star Schools military</u> <u>program launches (azpbs.org)</u> these Charter Schools understand how difficult it is for military children to adjust and transition when they constantly move. They set up peer mentor programs to help new students feel comfortable in a new environment.

"Legislation must be passed at the state level in order for Purple Star School designation. Such legislation has been written and proposed. If everything goes well, the governor will sign it into law in April during the month of the Military Child".
