Texas VFW Foundation Responds to Panhandle Wildfires

Texas VFW Foundation offers financial assistance to affected veterans and asks for public's help. AUSTIN, TX, February 29, 2024 –

The Texas Panhandle is currently experiencing the largest wildfire in Texas history with over one million acres consumed by fire and is less than 3% contained. The Texas VFW Foundation stands in solidarity with those impacted by these wildfires and offers support during this difficult time. We are extending more than just our thoughts and prayers. The Texas VFW Foundation offers disaster relief and other programs to help Texas veterans in need. Disasters create such loss and suffering. We are committed to making sure Texas veterans have every resource available to them.

The programs offered by the Texas VFW Foundation were developed by combat veterans and others to be able to respond with speed and empathy to address the most urgent needs: food, shelter, and security. However, we cannot do this alone. The Disaster Assistance Program is a financial assistance grant for qualifying Texas veterans affected by a natural or manmade disaster. Awardees can expect up to \$500 per veteran household. This grant is a one-time grant and can be used for needs of the veteran during the disaster, such as replenishing food stores, hotel stays, vehicle fuel, and/or other expenses incurred during and immediately after the disaster. In addition to the Disaster Assistance Program, qualifying applicants can apply for the Veterans' Assistance Program. This grant, funded in part by the Fund for Veterans' Assistance, can assist up to \$2,500 per veteran household for basic living needs such as rent/mortgage, utilities, vehicle payment, and/or auto insurance.

"The Texas VFW and the Texas VFW Foundation have been there for

Texas veterans through the Bastrop fires, Hurricanes Harvey and Katrina, and the West fertilizer plant explosion," stated Beth West, Executive Director. "Each disaster brings different needs, yet they are similar. Displacement and loss occur each time. The Disaster Assistance grant is designed to assist with those immediate needs first and the Veterans' Assistance grant is to help pay the bills during and following the disaster. We can only assist when we have sufficient funds to do so. If you are not affected by these wildfires, please 'pass the ammo' and help those veterans who are."

# Military members and their families can get free tax help

Military personnel who want to file free federal tax returns have several options, including the Department of Defense's MilTax and the IRS Free File program. These programs offer online tax preparation, electronic filing and direct deposit of refunds at no cost.

#### MilTax

The Department of Defense provides MilTax as a free tax resource for the military community. MilTax is a suite of tax services available for members of the military, as well as qualifying veterans and family members. There are no income limits

MilTax is designed exclusively for the military community. The software was developed specifically to address the unique circumstances of military life that can affect taxes such as combat pay and dealing with multiple moves within the same tax year. Eligible taxpayers can use MilTax to complete and electronically file a federal tax return and up to three state returns for free.



## National Council District #15 Member Chrissy Harlan

I attended the Mid-Year Conference and National Council of Administration meeting in February. The Council Members were asked to present their questions prior to the meeting with the assurance that the questions would be answered at the meeting.

The following questions were submitted to me by the members in Arizona and New Mexico and I emailed them to National Headquarters. What follows are the questions in black and the answers we were given are in red. Some of the questions were answered up front by National Secretary / Treasurer An Panteleakos and others I had to stand up and ask.

### 12 Month Budget:

**Consulting Services** - Do we have a contract and if so, why were we over budget? The new contract was more expensive than was expected. Does this include Condata's Software for accounting? Yes, it does. Are we sure that the \$250,000 Budgeted this year is adequate? Yes.

Credit Card Processing - How much do we pay for each credit card transaction? The costs vary depending on the Credit Card Company as they charge different rates. We also pay on rejected charges. Does this apply to debit cards? I am sorry but I did not write down the response to this question but I will get the answer if it is important to any of you. Last year we spent \$22,000 and budgeted \$23,000 this year. Is this amount budgeted adequately? They believe the budgeted amount is adequate.

National Convention - Banquets and Receptions - Is the Auxiliary involved in the planning of this event? What is being done to reduce the cost? Has eliminating this event been discussed? Last year we spent \$58,000 yet we only budgeted \$50,000 this year. Please explain why? The Auxiliary pays for 1/3 of the reception. We are contracted out for the next few years so we budget based on the contract price. The VFW is discussing eliminating this event in the future.

## **Sept - November Budget**

**Documentarian** - How can the Documentarian be over Budget or why were they allowed to book travel that exceeded their budget? Is all the travel for the Documentarian for the year now paid for or will this overage continue to rise? The Documentarian is not always the same person at each event so different people are booking the travel and the prices on travel increased more than expected. The airline tickets have already been purchased so the overage will increase a small amount for items such as luggage fees.

**CAFE** - This CAFE cost almost twice as much as was budgeted! We believe low turn out to this event due to its location should have been expected and better negotiations should have happened if this overage is due to our not filling the block of rooms contracted for. They based the block of rooms at the hotel on previous CAFÉ's and because we did not fill the block, we had to pay attrition. They will be lowering the number of rooms blocked in the future.

If the plan is frozen and terminated what impact will this have on the employees that are on the pension plan and the cash balance plan? Will they lose money/gain money? And how much of a loss? If approved what will the maximum amount of matching contribution be? Will this number remain the same? We are piggy backed on the VFW plan and the VFW has already frozen their side. A \$260,000 Annuity would be purchased to pay out to current and past employees on the plan. The cash plan can roll over to a 401K with no loss or can be taken as cash and pay a penalty. The questions on matching contributions were not answered.

#### Other Items brought forward:

Budgeting at this level is difficult due to very early planning. Work on the current (2023-2024) Budget began well over a year ago and inflation has occurred in all areas.

In an attempt to reduce costs Boot Camp will now be held right after the Fall Legislative Conference.

The Standing Rules allow the National President to travel First Class across the country and they are looking at making that only on flights of 3 hours or more.

The 5 Candidates for National Guard, Kim, Janie, Kay, Donna and Susan all spoke at the Conference.

## Secretary/Treasurer Kim Sloan

I had a wonderful time at the Mid Year Conference meeting. It's wonderful to see old friends and it's a great opportunity to talk with other Department Secretaries and Treasurers. We

exchange lots of ideas and information. Arizona and New Mexico should be thankful that we have a council member that is not afraid to

ask questions of the national leadership. After reviewing the budget reports, audits, financials there were a lot of questions.

Now on to some ongoing issues -

Annual Paying Transfers

When you have an annual member that transfers into your Auxiliary and is accepted, the Treasurer only needs to send me the application so that I can process the transfer. As soon as the member is transferred, the Treasurer can go into MALTA and pay that member's dues.

 The same applies to Transfer who want to convert to Life Member. The Treasurer only needs to send me the application which will transfer the member to that Auxiliary. Then the Treasurer can go into MALTA and convert that member to Life Member.

By doing it this way, it will save us both time.

- I'm seeing a lot of acronyms and initials on applications, mostly in the medals section but also in addresses. While you and I may know they stand for, someone in the future may not....so let's make sure that we use the full words i.e. ICM should be shown as Iraq Campaign Medal.
- Treasurers are forgetting to show the meeting date that the applicant was accepted by the Auxiliary. If that is the only item missing on an application, I will process the application and email the Treasurer for the date.
- If it's a new LM paying by credit card, the application will not be processed by the National Headquarters staff that process the cc payments. So let's all work on making sure that applications are complete.
- Secretary Minute Book Please review Bylaws Section 812 and Secretary Minutes in the Booklet of Instruction (Podium Yellow Section).

Members names should be shown in full; Motions must show who made the motion and who seconded the motion.

Treasurer Report must be incorporated in the minutes or attached to the minutes.

Audit Reports that are approved at that meeting need to be attached to the minutes.

#### **ELECTIONS**

Auxiliaries are to elect their 2023-2024 officers at their April meeting. Don't panic if you don't get all the offices filled at the April Meeting. You may continue elections for the unfilled offices at the May meeting. The critical offices are President, Secretary, Treasurer and Trustees. Since two of the Trustees automatically move up to 2yr and 1 yr. you only need to elect a new 3 year Trustee. If you have any questions about offices, officer responsibilities, installation of officers, etc. please reach out to me or to Asst. Department Secretary Chrissy Harlan.

Please make sure to review the Attendance Sheet that is on the website. In order to achieve Outstanding Auxiliary, the Auxiliary must have been represented at every District Meeting (to which that Auxiliary belongs) and at least one MIT. If the attendance sheet is not correct, please email me asap so that we can correct the error.

#### COMMUNICATING

How are you communicating with our members? Is it verbal, non-verbal, visual or written? No matter how you are communicating, start by thinking about what the reader or listener should think, feel and do once they've heard or read your message.

Prepare to present your idea clearly whether you are using



verbal or written.

- Be clear about the topic and cohesive by staying on the topic. Complete your idea with supporting content.
- Be concise by eliminating unnecessary words.
- Be concrete by using precise words. Be correct and most importantly be courteous.
- Your body language and tone of voice are very important.

Are you crossing your arms or talking loud? Are you rolling your eyes? If you are doing those things the conversation will not go as planned.

- After the message has been heard ask questions, don't interrupt the person giving the message.
- Be respectful of others time and opinions.
- Make request not demands.
- Be a active listener and try to understand the perspectives of others. Respect others differences and be patient.

When sending out a email or text - after writing it, take time to read it. Is it a clear topic? Is it cohesive? Is there supporting content? Is it correct and courteous? Don't use all capital letters, your meaning can and usually is misunderstood.

Remember the way you communicate and present your ideas will leave a lasting impression on others.

## Be an Advocate – Be Informed – Be Engaged

March is here and your VFW National Commander, his legislative staff,

U.S. Capitol, Washington D.C.

upcoming Department Junior Vice Commanders and yes, our Auxiliary President will be in Washington D.C. March 2-6 for meetings with the National committees and each State Representatives and/or Senators promoting our Priority Goals and talking points for our

Veterans.

These talking points will include bills and benefits for our military and Veterans in finances, health care, education, jobs, and of course mental health. The VFW and Auxiliary advocate for Veterans benefits and needs each year in mass on an executive level as well as throughout the year. They also let them know what the VFW has accomplished throughout the year and provide extensive input on the bills going through the process and committees to get our Veterans the best tools for their needs.

Please, if you are interested or want to learn more about what is said on Capital Hill, go to the apps store and download the VFW Washington Conference 2024. What is said and done here is great to bring back to your Auxiliaries and Posts to let them know what the VFW is doing for Veterans and also how your representatives in Washington vote through the year by knowing which legislation to follow.

Some talking points on a National level are HB736, Claim Sharks who are charging Veterans to fill out a claim telling them that they can get a claim prepared and a decision issued "faster" than accredited staff like the VFW employs. There is no way to prepare a claim faster or get it processed faster. Every veteran uses the same forms, follows the same rules, and goes through the same adjudication as every other veteran. They say they can get them processed faster due to backlog, VA "processes" claims, not anyone else. Our bill (HB736) focuses on "preparing" claims as that is where the Sharks are focusing their efforts to make money.

Arizona is the latest to try and stop lawyers from overcharging our Veterans for work our VSO officers can do. Recently our representatives at the State Capitol heard and voted on state bill HB2792 introduced by Travers, Payne, Gillette, and Seaman. The amendments added by Payne, due to comments from North Carolina and Florida lawyers, changed the bill to where even the originating Representatives had to vote down their own bill as it no longer protected veterans.

Other bills being introduced in February, with some not having a bill number as of this writing are:

2304 Change Buffalo Soldiers monument

2096 Tiny homes Exemptions on building codes

2143 Drivers license exemption fee for homeless

2603 Native American Veteran license plate

2392 Veteran Property tax exemptions

2552 Transitional Housing grants

2577 PTS Injury bill
