SUBJECT: Official Memorandum of Annual Dues Increase

Per the vote at the 2023 National Convention Delegates, starting July 1, 2024, the National Headquarters portion of annual dues will be increasing by \$5.00 for the 2025 dues year. For annual members associated with a local Auxiliary, the National portion of dues will be \$10.00 and for annual members that are Department at Large, the National portion of dues will be \$15.00

Due to this change it is **imperative** that each Auxiliary and Department review the annual dues amount that will be collected from continuous annual members for the 2025 dues year by June 30, 2024, in MALTA to determine if it should be updated.

If an Auxiliary is not charging enough to cover the increase of the National portion of annual dues for \$10 and Department portion of annual dues of \$?, it could result in the organization not receiving any membership dues when members pay their dues. Please note that National and Department portions will be paid first from annual dues and then the remainder will be the Auxiliary portion. Please see example below:

EXAMPLE: Currently Auxiliary XXXX charges a continuous annual member \$20 per year for dues. Of this \$20, the Auxiliary keeps \$10, the Department's portion is \$5, and the National portion is \$5. If an Auxiliary does not update their dues amount collected in MALTA by June 30, 2024, then on July 1, 2024, MALTA will still charge their annual members \$20 for dues. Of this \$20, \$5 will go to the Department, \$10 will go to National and thus the Auxiliary will only receive \$5 instead of the \$10 it previously received.

To update the dues amount charged in MALTA, there are two options:

- 1. The Secretary may update this amount when filing the Installation Report for the 2024-2025 year.
- 2. The Auxiliary Treasurer may update the dues amount in MALTA by clicking the Edit Dues Amount in MALTA under their Treasurer Duties tab and then clicking the blue button labeled Change Dues. Please note that the Treasurer has the ability to schedule the dues increase for the future and does not have to wait until June 30th to input this information.

As the 2023-2024 wraps up, I want to take the opportunity to recognize and thank all of you for an amazing and outstanding year for the Department of Arizona Auxiliary.

You knocked it out of the park for the "More than letters" campaign. Thank you, Linda Roloff, for showing us what an impact it has when we are saying Prisoners of War, Missing in Action, Killed in Action and by saying the whole name.

Crystal McCarthy took the challenge of Flags and Flowers from the young man at the National VFW convention and challenged many of us. She did not stop there though. She challenged the Department of Nevada, and I challenged the Department of Alabama. And then they challenged etc... etc... The challenge went viral across America and thousands of Veterans were honored by \Box .

In Arizona we laid 72,000 Wreaths across our great state. Almost 12,000 flags were given away to the community at parades, events and for our Veterans. That is outstanding!

May 4th, 2024 is the 3rd annual VFW Day of Service as part of the VFW's #StillServing campaign, which unites Veterans across America around a common goal — showing the nation the impact Veterans make in their communities. The Auxiliary can team up and do a community project with our children and other community members. Let's show the community that the VFW and VFW Auxiliary are willing to get our hands dirty and help out. Don't forget to go and register your event on the interactive day of service map and receive a special participation decal or find a local event to join in on and honor Veterans around the country by making a difference.

Armed Forces Day – Third Saturday in May. A day to pay tribute to the men and women currently serving in our nation's armed forces. The day was designed to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard Days, but the separate days are still observed, particularly within their respective services.

Run for the Wall (RFTW) will be all over Arizona overnighting May 14th, 15th and 16th. They will have lunch in Needles CA and Blythe CA before crossing into AZ and they also go through the white mountains. They will be on Interstate 40 and Interstate 10, so watch out for motorcycles. These patriots will overnight in Williams, Flagstaff and Casa Grande. RFTW comes into Casa Grande 5/15 about 5pm for dinner at The Elks Lodge. The next morning 5/16 is the arrival into Marana Az at approximately 745 am. After morning briefing, they are off to Willcox for lunch. This is the 34th year for Run for the Wall. It has conducted its mission of promoting healing among all Veterans and their families and friends, calling for an accounting of all Prisoners of War and those Missing in Action (POW/MIA), to honor the memory of those Killed in Action (KIA) from all wars, and to support our military personnel around the world.

This mission is supported by thousands of citizens from communities like yours who come out to greet the riders, who provide donated gas and often times food, and most importantly demonstrate their patriotism and support. As riders work their way across America, whether from California to D.C or D.C. to Marseilles, IL., they visit towns and communities, Veteran organizations like the VFW and American Legion, VA Centers and hospitals, schools, Gold Star families, and civic organizations to help spread the word. They need your help to promote the healing of those who have answered our nations call; to help remind our legislators that we need the accountability that was promised; and most importantly, we need to NEVER FORGET those who sacrificed all for us. They'd love to have you come out to meet and greet the riders along the Route of RFTW. Rftw.us is the website and you can see if they are stopping near you. VFW National pays for fuel for all the riders as they stop in Kansas City on Midway Route, and you can count it on a PAR for Americanism and Veterans and Family Support. They would love to see you as they work their

way across this great country of ours, showing Patriotism is alive and thriving across America.

Thank you all for the hard work and dedication to our veterans and their families and their communities. I enjoyed seeing all of the Americanism reports and how much you involved the community and other programs in your projects. Many of you included our youth and as we know we need to teach our next generation that freedom is not free. Don't stop! We have much more to do and I'm excited to see you at State Convention and the new programs for next year. I know that you will love the new ideas we have in store for you.

Buddy Poppy & VFW National Home Connie Hargraves

What a year for Buddy Poppy and for our VFW National Home. All the Auxiliaries that sent in reports had fantastic Buddy Poppy Drives. They incorporated Budy Poppies

with other programs; many with all programs. It was great to see everyone embrace remembering those who did not make it home and educating our members and community with the Poppy story!

Please, next year, check out the requirements for the program awards. They often are directed at specific things like educating the community, working with a youth group, giving and event or promoting within the community not just the VFW/Aux.

I received a lot of feedback on favorite things like painting rocks, painting tiles, giving them to Veterans, placing them in various locations and encouraging finders to post where they found it, attaching cards with the rocks on what the poppy design represented, posting on Facebook, sending the activity to local newspapers, radio stations, schools or other organizations that you hid the rocks, it even inspired a VFW Painted Rock page on Facebook for all Auxiliaries nationwide to do the same.

I painted some rocks, ok, maybe it was hard to tell they were poppies but the House representing National Home was spot on, and I left one or two in 14 different states. I had a response back from 6 people in 4 states, one Facebook entry and that was from those I saw. Great program thanks for SHARING!

Another Auxiliary at their Lady Veteran luncheons had Poppies all throughout the decorations and gave out a Poppy pin to returning Lady Veterans. Not all the Lady Veterans were Auxiliary or VFW members, what a great recruiting tool and event to showcase what we do for Women Veterans and their families. How about wrapping Lollipops with "Buddy" Poppies and handing them out at a Community Festival. Handing out educational material on Buddy Poppies and National Home and attaching "lollipop with "Buddy" Poppy to the material being handed out.

"Buddy" Poppy drives at local businesses; one Auxiliary from Oct 14 to Nov 14 did a drive at Lowes, had a raffle and raised \$102 for National Home Welcome Center project. They did a Happy New Year basket, raised \$127 that was sent to National Home And a "Shop Local Basket" with items donated from Local Business raising another \$137 for National Home. Do a bake sale, decorate bake goods with homes, flowers, 4H animals like pigs and rabbits, and other projects the kids do at National Home.

One Auxiliary made homemade pillowcases for Veterans who were in Hospice, included with the pillowcase was a poppy, a thank you letter from Auxiliary President and posted the project on Facebook to share with other Auxiliaries; this project utilized the Hospital fund in the hospital program.

The #poppiescount contest had 8 auxiliaries sending in project reports utilizing this hashtag on Facebook, and "Buddy" Poppy and media. Win, win. Three posts won a Poppy pin for reading my article and participating.

11 National Home life memberships were sent in for the next competition found in my article. 4 poppy pins were awarded. Again, National Home education was the National certificate qualification, media, community education as they could be VFW/Aux members of non-members. Many attached Poppy sticker to the information on National Home brochure, applications!

Remember, it is the 100th Anniversary of the National Home in 2025. I would like to see many of the Auxiliaries do an event celebrating that monumental Anniversary, promote what the National Home does for Veteran families, including the Crisis Line and resources they provide. Encourage purchase of National brick, \$100, Life membership \$50, Centennial Life Membership \$100, and the Centennial Brick \$500 (limited quantity).

Thank you all again. I had a great time being your chairman for "Buddy" Poppy National Home this year. I hope you keep coming up with unique ideas for the coming year.

I cannot wait to see who made Outstanding Auxiliary this year! What about outstanding project in each of the program categories? The suspense is unreal!



<u>Legacy Project</u> to commemorate Veterans and service members interred in VA national cemeteries and VA grant-funded state, territorial, and tribal Veterans cemeteries through the discovery and sharing of their stories. As a part of this grant, we are launching the <u>2024 War II</u>:

Portraits of Service Awards.



According to the National WWII Museum, only 167,284 WWII veterans were still alive at the end of 2022, just one percent of the sixteen million Americans who served during the defining military conflict of the twentieth century. As the WWII generation recedes into history, GLI believes that it is essential to instill in younger generations a deeper understanding of their service and sacrifice. The Portraits of Service contest aims to encourage students to commemorate their stories.

Students will create a biographical portrait of a WWII veteran. Portraits could include written reports, eulogies, videos, podcasts, poems, or songs. A teacher or guardian can submit student work on their behalf. GLI will offer **ten \$500 awards** to top submissions, and winners will be featured on our website. The deadline to submit is **Friday, May 3, at 8:00 am EST**.
