### Department Assistant Secretary – Chrissy Harlan

By now your Elections are over and possibly your Installations as well. Now it is time for the paperwork, ugh!

Per Section 806A of the National Bylaws it is the responsibility of the Secretary to transmit the Installation (Election) Report to both National Headquarters and to the Department Secretary.

Immediately after the election is completed, the Secretary needs to complete the Installation Report. The Installation Report is on the Department website: <a href="https://vfwauxaz.org">https://vfwauxaz.org</a>, under Resources/Secretary, 2022-2023 Installation Report for Auxiliaries and Districts.

This form is **FILLABLE**, **YEA!** You will notice that not all Officers are listed on this form so be sure to add Chaplain, Conductor/Conductress, Guard and Patriotic Instructor on the back or on a separate sheet of paper. Get all of the new officers' information on the spot to save you time and aggravation with having to look it all up in Malta later.

Transmitting the report to National is done through MALTA. What follows is step-by-step instructions for entering your officers in Malta in case you are not familiar with it. Only Secretaries have access to enter officers into Malta.

Sign in to Malta

Click Duties (Secretary for whichever level you serve on)

Click Officers / Installations then Future Officers

The list of current officers will populate for you. At this point you either extend the term of the officer OR input the member number of the newly elected officer. The information for the new office will automatically populate but you need to crosscheck with the information you were given by the officer. Enter all of your officers then click save. Verify your meeting date and time as well as the amount of your dues, Click save and print, then your all done reporting to National Headquarters!

Now on to submitting your report to the Department. The Department uses the information from the Report Form to develop the Department Roster. Simply email me at <a href="mailto:vfwkidsrus@gmail.com">vfwkidsrus@gmail.com</a> the Report Form and you're all done.

### 2021-2022 DEPARTMENT Delegates and Alternates Instructions

### • Review Bylaws Sec 304

Delegates and Alternates to the Department Meetings and Convention shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the Department Convention.

Auxiliaries should elect their Delegates and Alternates at their April meeting as Department Convention will be start on June 2.

### Number of Delegates and Alternates

National Bylaws state that the number of Delegates and Alternates may be set forth differently in the Department Bylaws. Department of Arizona Bylaws call for one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election.

### **EXAMPLE:**

On the night Delegates and Alternates are to be elected, MALTA shows the Auxiliary has 102 members in good standing.

102 divided by 10 = 10.2 (.2 is fraction thereof and so you round up to 11) Therefore the Auxiliary would elect 11 Delegates and 11 Alternates

### Election

Delegates and Alternates are elected by the members – they are NOT appointed. Most Auxiliaries have more Delegates/Alternates than attend Auxiliary meetings. Note that members do not have to be present to be elected as a Delegate or Alternate. The membership should consider those members who may not be able to attend Auxiliary meetings but do attend the Department Convention. All Delegates and Alternates must be members in good standing of that Auxiliary (life members or current annual members).

### • Department Composition Members

The Auxiliary President has his/her own vote at the Department Convention and should be listed at the bottom of the form AND as an Alternate in the right column.

The National District Council Member, any Department Officers and Past Department Presidents, that are members of your Auxiliary have their own vote at Department Convention. They should be listed at the bottom of the form and should be considered for election as an Alternate. They will need to notify the Credentials Chairman if they are voting as a Delegate or voting their own vote.

If the Auxiliary President is the only Delegate or Alternate at the Department Convention, he/she may choose to vote as a Delegate rather than as Auxiliary President. In the example above, the Auxiliary is entitled to 11 votes (each Delegate has one vote) plus the President's vote. But if the President chooses to vote as a Delegate (which he/she may do if all of the Delegates are not present) he/she would cast 11 votes instead of just the President's vote.

- PRINT OR TYPE ALL INFORMATION It is acceptable to print the list and attach it to the Delegate form.
- Submit to the Department Secretary AND the Department

### Credentials Chairman.

The Auxiliary Secretary is responsible for sending the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the Department Secretary and the Department Credentials Chairman. This list should be sent immediately after election.

### Fees

Registration/Delegate Fees are \$4.00 based on number of Delegates the Auxiliary is entitled to, plus \$4 for each Department composition members shown at the bottom of the Delegate List.

Example: The Auxiliary is entitled to and elects 35 Delegates (\$140), plus the Auxiliary President (\$4.00), plus the District President is a member of that Auxiliary (\$4.00) plus there is one Department Officer (\$4.00) and one Past Department President(\$4.00) that are members of that Auxiliary.

The Auxiliary Secretary would give a copy of the Delegate List to the Treasurer and request a check for \$156).

### Arrearages / Audits

Sec. 511 If a District is in arrears for failing to submit accepted audits to the Department Treasurer within thirty (30) calendar days of each meeting (or quarterly, if monthly meetings are held) the District President shall be deprived of their vote at the Department Convention.

### • Term

Delegates/Alternates serve for one (1) full year from the date of election to the next election.

### Absence

If the Auxiliary President is absent or not in the room, the Auxiliary Sr. Vice President or in their absence, the Auxiliary Jr. Vice President may function as the Department Composition member.

- \$50.00 could pay 2 Annual Members' dues in most Auxiliaries
- \$50.00 is the cost of a Lifetime Membership to the VFW National Home for Children
- A \$50.00 gift certificate to the VFW Store could purchase an item to help the Auxiliary.
   Members feel more a part of the team.
- \$50.00 could be a recruitment incentive. There are many ways for the Auxiliary to consider "how" \$50.00 could best motivate the Auxiliary to reach 100% +1 and 90% in Annual Member Retention.

  Invite Members to participate and keep in touch.
- Texting works! Instant response!
- Invite Members to "Activate" their account in MALTA- win/win- they learn about the VFW Auxiliary Membership tool- and have availability to pay their Annual Membership or "Convert to Life" and instantly have access to their new Membership card.

May/June Patriotic holidays are upcoming on the calendar. While participating in a Poppy drive- have Membership applications available with someone friendly, outgoing, courteous, knowledgeable ready to invite new persons to join the VFW Auxiliary. Look to the great VFW Auxiliary Membership tools—"Recruitment Booth Pointers" <a href="VFW-Auxiliary-Recruitment-Booth-Pointers-updated.pdf">VFW-Auxiliary-Recruitment-Booth-Pointers-updated.pdf</a> (vfwauxiliary.org)

Tip: Have the Auxiliary programs' information in a 3 ring binder- ready-to-access for their interest- not cluttering the table. Have \*something\* to draw children to the table such as hand-held American flags, pencils, small tokens, candy- most all Veterans will approach the table for a Buddy Poppy. Invite Veterans, who are not eligible for the VFW, to be at the forefront of advocating for Veterans' rights? Encourage them as a Veteran Advocate to join the VFW Auxiliary.

Congratulations and Well Done Arizona!....We are strong...We are adaptable...We are important members of our Communities!

With our newsletter covering the months of both May and June, here are some important



times that you could reach out to other local organizations to partner with for events.

On May 1st, National Loyalty Day recognizes American freedom and is set aside for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and the recognition of the heritage of American freedom. Many municipalities will have events that call for Americans to raise the flags, pray, or reflect on their heritage, each of them recognizes an inherent need for the country to be united in our basic ideals. Their messages speak of loyalty and freedom in equal measure, especially for those who serve in the military.

May 1<sup>st</sup> is also Silver Star Service Banner Day. The day also recognizes service members awarded the Silver Star Medal. Americans honor the sacrifices of the combat wounded, ill, and dying service members across all branches of The United States military, the Silver Star Service Banner and Flag honor Silver Star families for their services and gallantry. Ask if your city is willing to honor their local Silver Star Families and ask how you can help.

National Teacher Appreciation Day, also known as National Teacher Day, recognizes dedicated educators across the country. As part of Teacher Appreciation Week, the celebration takes place on the Tuesday of the first full week in May each year.

National Teacher Appreciation Week is the first Monday thru Friday in May, with the National Teachers Day on Tuesday of the First Full Week in May. No matter where we are in life, a teacher influenced us. They continue to impact our lives every day, too! When we meet new employees with a wealth of skills and abilities, a teacher helped shaped them. Every new business owner, doctor, engineer, or nurse can name a teacher who inspired them. Every one of us has at least one teacher in mind who encouraged and motivated us during our education. Check with local PTA (Parent Teacher Assoc.) and booster clubs to see how you can partner with them to honor these special heroes.

A few other May Items:

National Nurses Week begins on May 6th and ends on May 12th, which is the birthday of Florence Nightingale (May 12, 1820 – August 13, 1910). And National Student Nurse Day takes part during National Nurses Week on May 8th. The day honors student nurses as they pursue a career in medicine. They will be there in the future as new first responders!

Every May 15th, Peace Officer Memorial Day pays tribute to local, state, and federal law enforcement officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice or been injured in the line of duty. The observance takes place during Police Week in which many organizations, government agencies, and private citizens fly flags at half-staff in memory of those officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice. Offer to assist with the crowds during these events, setting up chairs or passing out water, etc.

In Arizona, we have some special hazards that we can partner with our local Fire and emergency services to assist them with community awareness education:

National Wildfire Awareness Month dedicates the entire month of May to

prevention and preparedness. National Wildfire Awareness Month has been declared in 10 western states to increase prevention and preparedness for wildfires throughout the country. There are steps to take to both prevent wildfires and prevent them. From fire-resistant building materials to following the safety protocols for handling fire when camping, heating your home, or storing fuel, we can all take part in reducing wildfires. International Firefighters Day is observed on May 4.

National Water Safety Month in May prepares us for recreational activities. Water is an attraction during the summer months. Whether we're drawn to lakes and rivers or public pools and water slides, safety is a necessary concern. We use the water for leisure, sport, and general outdoor relaxation. Boating with or without motors, swimming, fishing, and many other kinds of recreation take place in and around the water.

June also has a lot of opportunities for us to offer our time and energy to help our local organizations for the betterment of our communities.

National Safety Month in June is an opportunity to make a difference in your home, work, and community. Many local fire departments utilize this month to teach safety courses regarding CPR, Wildfire protection and response, and in Arizona, the warning signs of heat exposure both outside and in homes.

June 27th, National Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Awareness Day recognizes the effects post-traumatic stress has on the lives of those impacted by it. PTSD has a profound effect on the lives of those who suffer from it. The statistics alone are staggering, but can only tell a portion of the story. The trauma and anxiety associated with PTSD are a constant burden, inseparable from the sufferer. It was once a condition that was attributed only to returning combat veterans, but more and more the condition is diagnosed in those who have experienced violent crime or lived through catastrophic events.

According to PTSD United, 20% of adults in the United States who have experienced a traumatic event suffer from PTSD. Please look to your health care facilities to work with them on their quest to recognize and assist not only those who suffer from PTSD but also the families of those individuals.

This has been an outstanding year for our organization to get involved with so many other organizations which are also dedicated to the betterment of the communities in which we live. The Auxiliary Community Outreach Program has been at the forefront of not only bringing our organization and mission to better public knowledge, but it has also been a catalyst for welcoming new members! Well done Arizona!!

   Start the project on Loyalty Day, May 1, and conclude on Flag Day, June 14<sup>th</sup> with your Flag Retirement Ceremony.
- 2. Hold a public ceremony such as the rededication of a local memorial or stage a community program at a park or auditorium. Remember our men and women currently serving on active duty and in the National Guard and Reserve.

Let us take the opportunity on May 1 and June 14 to rekindle patriotism and remember men and women serving in our military.

In addition, on these and Memorial Day, if you are participating in a parade or throwing a party – try to get as many Flags as possible and Buddy Poppies out with your youth and adults and help them understand the importance of the Flag and its etiquette. Table decorations are always a wonderful place to display these as well as Our Pledge of Allegiance, Flag Retirement Instructions, and proper replacement of Flags.

Any reason for a gathering is an exciting time to do a table with many Programs. Just thinking about how much we can accomplish during May and June – lots of people around in the community that you might educate and involve in our Mission in addition to offering a wonderful time for a membership drive.

### **Loyalty Day**

Loyalty Day is observed on May 1 in the United States. It is a day set aside "for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and for the recognition of the heritage of American freedom". The date, May 1, was set in order to counter "International Worker's Day" also known as "May Day".

### The First Red Scare

In the wake of World War I, The Russian Revolution of 1917 saw the Bolsheviks, topple the Romanov dynasty, kicking off the rise of the communist party and inspiring international fear of Bolsheviks and anarchists. Even in America labor union and workers strikes were common place often accompanied by violence of all sorts. As May 1, 1920 approached there was fear of a coordinated, worldwide communist uprising to include a plot to overthrow the United States Government.

### From the VFW National website

"Loyalty Day originally began as "Americanization Day" in 1921 as a counter to the Communists' May 1 celebration of the Russian Revolution. On May 1, 1930, 10,000 VFW members staged a rally at New York's Union Square to promote patriotism."

### The Second Red Scare (Thanks again Wikipedia)

Occurring immediately after World War II, was preoccupied with the perception that national or foreign communists were infiltrating or subverting U.S. society and the federal government. The name refers to the red flag as a common symbol of communism.

### **Continued from VFW National website**

"Through a resolution adopted in 1949, May 1 evolved into Loyalty Day. Observances began in 1950 on April 28 and climaxed May 1 when more than five million people across the nation held rallies. In New York City, more than 100,000 people rallied for America. In 1958 Congress enacted Public Law 529 proclaiming Loyalty Day a permanent fixture on the nation's calendar."

President Ronald Reagan Proclamation 5645 -- Loyalty Day, 1987

"Let us make our observance of Loyalty Day one of reflection on all the profound good that our experiment in individual liberty and limited government has meant for the United States of America and for the hope of the world. Let us rekindle in every heart the unshakeable strength and purpose that was our forefathers'. Let us ask the Author of Liberty, as did they, to bless and protect the United States. In these ways we will, in loyalty, fulfill our sacred trust to "secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity."

### From a speech by R W Appleton

"In this country each of us understands that if we want to enjoy those rights guaranteed by our Constitution, we must defend the right of the other person to do the same. Each time we have been called to defend our nation, we Americans of all colors, from all backgrounds, have fought with and for each other. We Americans from every region, race and religion on the earth have formed a single, strong, unified, powerful nation. If all nations would follow our example, there would be no wars; no need for sad remembrances of our honored dead; no grieving loved ones at home."

Loyalty Day will be this coming Sunday May 01, 2022. All Posts and Auxiliaries are highly encouraged to hold an Observance Ceremony honoring not only our Country but the high ideals it was founded upon.

### **VFW GRANTS AVAILABLE TO AUXILIARIES**

VFW Foundation leadership and staff are proud to assist VFW and VFW Auxiliary members with service projects that increase their members' impact upon their communities. The VFW Foundation has budgeted \$500,000 in grant funding to support and encourage VFW Post and Auxiliary community service projects throughout the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

Both a VFW Post and its Auxiliary may receive funding during the grant cycle. Posts and Auxiliaries are encouraged to apply early, as funding is often exhausted by early spring.

Eligibility information and forms can be found at <u>vfw.org</u> under Community/Community Initiatives. Forms are also listed below and are on the Department webpage - <u>vfwauxaz.org</u> under programs/community outreach.

The Home Depot Community Impact Grant has permanently been retired. Over the past 15 years, the grant has provided millions of dollars in funding to VFW Posts (and other nonprofits) for improvement of their buildings. The company will still support veteran causes with emphasis on veteran housing grants.

The Uniting to Combat Hunger (UTCH) Grant will reopen on Feb. 1, 2022. Through this grant program, Posts and Auxiliaries donating funds and food to their local food banks, food pantries and community kitchens may apply for up to \$5,000 in grant funding. 





Dear Veteran,

You may be eligible for newly enacted service-connected benefits.

Over the course of the last six months, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has begun processing service-connected disability claims for six new presumptive conditions related to environmental exposures during military service. We request your help in making more Veterans aware of these newly added presumptive conditions to help them file a claim and obtain any earned benefits.

In May 2021, VA started implementing provisions of the William M. Thornberry National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (NDAA), adding bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism to the list of medical conditions presumptively associated with exposure to Agent Orange. A few months later VA added asthma, rhinitis and sinusitis (to include rhinosinusitis) on a presumptive basis based on particulate matter exposures during military service in Southwest Asia and certain other areas.

Any Veteran who was previously denied service-connection for any of these six conditions but had symptoms manifest within 10 years of military service would need to file a supplemental claim. Be sure to use <u>VA Form 20-0995</u>, <u>Decision Review Request: Supplemental Claim</u> when filing. The claim form should include the name of the condition and specify that the condition is being claimed due to in-service exposure to environmental hazards.

VA is committed to assisting Veterans who may have been exposed to hazardous materials during their military service.

Be sure to stay plugged in to <u>www.va.gov</u> for the most recent developments around environmental exposures during military service, as VA is constantly conducting research and surveillance as well as reviewing scientific literature for conditions that may be related to exposure during military service.

#### Ride United

United Way Worldwide, in partnership with Lyft, has launched the Ride United initiative to address unmet transportation needs for individuals and families in communities across the country, by providing free Lyft rides to 2-1-1 callers for specific, eligible use cases.

#### Eligibility

- Ride need is one of the approved eligible use cases.
  - Health: medical/dental/eye appointment and testing; substance use support; mental health support/community support; apply for Medicare/Medicaid/CHIP services; return home from ER; Veterans Affairs services; pharmacy services; vaccine appointments
  - o Employment: job interview; commute to/from work; pre-employment needs
  - Food: grocery store; prepared/hot meals; food pantry/bank; SNAP/WIC benefits access
  - Economic stability: financial coaching/empowerment; tax preparation services; essential supplies (non-food); record obtainment (SSN, birth/death certificate, etc.); transportation services (DMV, car repair, etc.)
  - <u>Legal</u>: eviction court; court ordered community service; probation/parole check-in; court ordered education; commute to/from court proceedings/counsel
  - Housing: accessing and maintaining benefits (vouchers, rental assistance, etc.);
     emergency shelter; utilities assistance
  - Education: enrollment; commute to/from school, class, daycare; guardian school engagement; library or internet access
- Maximum of six (6) rides (each trip counts as one ride, so a round-trip would be two rides)
- Client must be 18 years or older (unless accompanied by a parent/guardian)
- Ride is a reasonable distance (average cost of a ride is \$18.50, or approximately 8-10 miles). Any
  one-way ride over \$20 requires a reason there is not a closer alternative and may be subject to
  supervisor approval. To get a Fare Estimate go to: <u>Fare Estimate</u>.
- Clients must comply with <u>Lyft's Health Safety Requirements</u>

#### FAQ's

#### Does a client need a cellphone?

For †Flexible Rides, the client does need a cellphone to receive the ride because they will get the SMS (text) confirming the ride when they book. If the client doesn't have any access to a mobile phone (or is landline only), we will not be able to send them a flexible ride.

Other types of rides are available for clients with cellphones without internet access or who do not have cellphones. These rides can be for an immediate need or scheduled for a specific time. Clients can call 1-800-836-LYFT to request these rides.

#### †What is a Flexible Ride?

For Flexible Rides, agents can send a client a link that has all the ride and location information locked in, but they can hail the ride on their own within 24 hours of receiving the link. For a one-way ride, the client would receive one link. For a round-trip ride, the client would receive two separate links. #### Are there wheelchair accessible vehicles?

Unfortunately, the platform used to dispatch rides does not have the ability to specify vehicles beyond a sedan or the options listed in the portal. Lyft does not yet have many drivers who have accessible vehicles. However, if the client has a foldable wheelchair or other device that can fit in a traditional car (including trunk), we can of course use a ride for them. Similarly, if a client has a carrier, car seat, or booster seat for their child that can be used in a traditional car, we can also use a ride for them, though they should bring their own car seat. A driver can decline to give a ride if a proper child seat is not provided by the passenger and is deemed unsafe.

Is it okay for a caregiver to ride along with someone who is headed to a medical appointment? Yes. There is no additional cost of having a caregiver or caseworker ride with the client.

#### Are service animals allowed in Lyft vehicles?

Yes, service animals are allowed to accompany clients on rides.
