

A note written to Jeanne Kentch, Mohave County Assessor and co-author of Proposition 130:

Questions and responses.

**Q:** Will Proposition 130 Exemption for Veteran disability be similar to the widow/widower "exemption" form that was to be submitted to the County Assessor by a given date?

**A:** Yes, it will. It is another exemption program that will require the same qualifications as the widow/widower/100% disabled program. The only difference is that it will include the disabled Veteran, of any disability. If the Veteran is 50% disabled, they will receive 50% of the exemption.

**Q:** When will Proposition 130 go into effect?

**A:** January 1, 2023.

**Q:** What will the disabled Veteran need as "proof" of their % of disability?

**A:** A letter from the VA describing their disability percentage.

**Q:** Is it still "more than 30% disabled"?

**A:** Any disability, if a Veteran, will garner exemption. The exemption amount depends on their disability percentage.

**Q:** What will the "income allowance/regulation" be for the % of disability to be realized off the Veteran property tax?

**A:** 2023 Income max to qualify is \$36,077 per household and \$43,733 with children.
