

• Chief of Staff/Mentoring: What Can I Do to Ensure my Auxiliary is Healthy?

Recently a number of Auxiliaries have had members act independently of their Auxiliary in any number of ways, such as requesting donations on behalf of the Auxiliary without Auxiliary

approval. These members are usually acting in what they believe is the best interest of the Auxiliary, but sometimes not. The VFW Auxiliary requires a member when representing the Auxiliary in any way have the authority to do so by a motion made and approved at a meeting. While the Bylaws do not specifically address this issue, Robert's Rules of Order does address the issue.

Firstly by defining the Auxiliary as an Deliberate Assembly (See pg 1) It is a group of people, having or assuming freedom to act in concert, meeting to determine, in full and free discussion, courses of action to be taken in the name of the entire group.

Then it goes further (See pg 4):

The basic principle of decision in a deliberative assembly is that, to become the act or choice of the body, a proposition must be adopted by a majority vote; that is, direct approval-implying assumption of responsibility for the act-must be registered by more than half of the members present and voting on the particular matter, in a regular or properly called meeting of the body.

If you have any further questions on this particular issue, please contact me.

Remember that District Secretaries need to send in minutes from the District meetings. This is the only way for Auxiliaries to get credit for attending these meetings for the Circle of Excellence.

Before you put that application in the mail to me, please make sure that all the information is legible. I am getting applications that I can't read. They are either too dark or too light, or they are cut off on the edges.

Department will be sending out annual dues notices in September. Please work on retaining your members by encouraging them to pay their dues before Dec 31st.

September is a great month to **'shift into gear**" for legislation!



September is full of opportunities to promote

registering to vote, "Vote with a Veteran in Mind" since there are many bills being presented for Women and Women's health care during September "Woman Veteran Month".

Keep encouraging your representatives both State and Federal to vote for and introduce bills on Woman health issues, jobs, education and helping them with PTSD needs.

There are three opportunities for Flag raisings on

Patriot Day, 9-11 - 20th Anniversary of 9/11 Twin Towers, Pentagon and the people who crashed the Plane in Pennsylvania more than likely saving the attack on the White House. All the people lost their lives including the first responders from the Police and Firefighters/Emergency techs. Yes, the legislation surrounding this event including those who fought so many years after. There are many bills presented and more to come to help our Veterans and their families.

September 18th POW/MIA Day - the third Saturday in September. Have a flag raising on Labor Day and honor front line workers who had an interesting year and still in some cases must wear masks. Hand out water bottles with the sticker "Vote in Honor of _____ a United States Veteran (they can fill in a Veteran name). Have a table set out to sign up for Action Corp weekly, encourage your members to advocate for the Veterans and their families with their elected officials utilizing this wonderful tool which lets them know about bills coming up for vote and in one quick click, send advocacy letters to their officials.

Hold a flag raising at your local school for **Constitution Day September 16 or 17**, depending on whether they have school on Friday.

For **Constitution Day** utilize the SOS activity book, Arizona, which educates on Arizona Legislation and Civic activities. It has word search, coloring pages, connect the dots and other items dealing with Arizona law. Hand out pocketbooks on the Constitution, and Flag etiquette. Bring in information on how many flags and the history of the United States on when the Congress voted the designs of the flag in. There are several word search, word scrambles and puzzles available online. Use the VFW Pledge of Allegiance coloring books. Have your auxiliary members do a word search at a meeting, set a time, see how many they find in 5 minutes. Create a skit on how a bill is created and passed.

Contact your women veterans and ask them to attend the flag raisings, encourage them to have their voice heard by signing up for Action Corp weekly. Hold an event like a luncheon or dinner and invite your representatives to meet the Women Veterans of your Post and Auxiliary and talk to them about their needs and concerns.

Educate your members on issues pertaining to Vietnam Veterans on POW/MIA Day September 18th. Bring up issues that pertain to them as well as Agent Orange or burn pits. Encourage Veterans to speak about the problems and issues they face.

Set out a voter registration table at events and at the Post.

If you do a Family Freedom Festival or Buddy Poppy Drive, set out sign up sheet for **Action Corps Weekly**, some of the information they provide and teach what they do. Also have the VFW Priority Goals set out, order enough for

the year. Labor Day, September 6th would be a great time to involve Veterans, their families and local representatives.

September is Suicide Awareness Month,

This is a great time to advocate for more programs for Veterans, mental health, PTSD, adjusting to civilian life, education, access to health needs, help for family members who also need to know how to recognize the signs and be able to help. Set out the cards for the crisis line.

Remember, Legislation is not always a top priority or not always understood as to the importance of being involved. Education, especially in this program, is a necessity. Make it fun.

On September 11, 2001 al-Qaeda launched a series of coordinated terrorist attacks upon the United States, killing almost 3,000 people. In the immediate



aftermath of the tragic events, the President proclaimed September 14, 2001 as a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of the Terrorist Attacks on September 11, 2001. A year later, September 11 was made a National Day of Mourning referred to as Patriot Day. This observance has been proclaimed annually since 2002.

Throughout the nation, municipalities are planning events to remember the citizens and first responders who lost their lives during the attack on our nation 20 years ago. Patriot Day; you could step up and volunteer with your communities during these events. Contact your City Councils, Chambers of Commerce, churches and other charitable organizations to see how your members can help.

Social media is also an excellent source of event information.

Most of the events that I have seen being advertised are outside and you could set up water stations or pass out small flags to attendees. It is the gift of your time that should be recorded for the program.

This has also been a time of environmental challenges, due to both fire and monsoon seasons. Fires and flash flooding from monsoon rains, have left behind displaced people and animals. Please check how you can assist your communities to help those in need. Many areas need volunteers at the food banks, animal shelters and with general clean-ups. Many local homes and businesses are dealing with issues left by the receding waters from flash flooding.

Remember your area homeless during monsoon season. In both the high country and the valley, the homeless need help with extremely hot temperatures and protection from rain. Consider holding a "Tarp Drive" to collect new tarps to hand out to your homeless. A Tarp can be a buffer from the scorching land and a dry protection from heavy rain.

When we are United in our cause, we are Strong for our neighbors, forming an Awesome Community of caring.

The Community Outreach Program is about giving our yourself and your time. The gift of time to others is priceless!

the Administration From for Community Living Website: "Celebrated every November, Family National Caregivers Month (NFCM) is a time to recognize and honor family

caregivers across the country. It offers an opportunity to raise awareness of caregiving issues, educate communities, and increase support for caregivers. ...

Families are the primary source of support for older adults and people with disabilities in the U.S. Many caregivers work and also provide care, experiencing conflicts between competing responsibilities. Research indicates caregiving also takes a significant emotional, physical, and financial toll. With nearly half of all caregivers over age 50, many are vulnerable to a decline in their own health. Studies show that coordinated support services can reduce caregiver depression, anxiety, and stress, and enable them to provide care longer, which avoids or delays the need for costly institutional care."

So, in November plan on recognizing caregivers in your area. You most likely only need to look as far as your members to find caregivers, but you do not need to limit yourself to your members. Plan on providing recognition or honor. It does not have to be large or expensive.

Some suggestions from Veterans and Family Support National Ambassador Nelda Clifton:

- "Be a listening ear. Visit with them in-person, by phone or electronically.
- Bring or have delivered a meal or a gift card to a local eatery.
- Mail a thinking of you card or flowers.
- Personal care gift cards for a spa day."

You can also offer your time – help them with errands, with yard work, or help them with finding information on the internet. And it would be great if you would continue to have contact with them after November.

Also, provide them information:

- 1. Seek support from other caregivers. You are not alone!
- 2. Take care of your own health so that you can be strong enough to take care of your loved one.

- 3. Accept offers of help and suggest specific things people can do to help you.
- 4. Learn how to communicate effectively with doctors.
- 5. Caregiving is hard work so take respite breaks often.
- 6. Watch out for <u>signs of depression</u> and don't delay getting professional help when you need it.
- 7. Be open to new technologies that can help you care for your loved one.
- 8. Organize medical information so it's up to date and easy to find.
- 9. Make sure legal documents are in order.
- 10. Give yourself credit for doing the best you can in one of the toughest jobs there is!




